

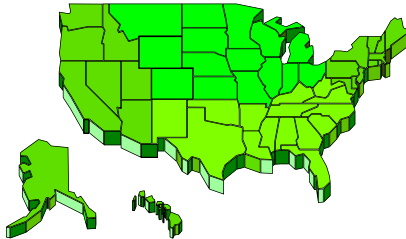

## FOUNDER TO LAUNCH 50 STATE SPEAKING TOUR 2001



## BOARD OF TRUSTEES TO MEET AGAIN

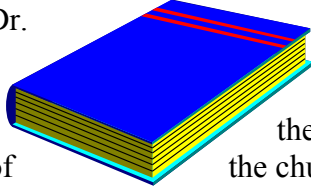
