







The Risks Inherent in Sex Education and the Need to Teach Abstinence



> **Tony Devine**



YOUTH Festival



We welcome representatives from CARP chapters around the world, CARP alumni and friends to this World CARP Convention and Youth Festival. Held for the first time in Korea in 1985, the Conventions have brought tens of thousands of students from around the world together in exciting exchange programs, debates and friendly competition.

Whether in Seoul, Tokyo, New York, Berlin, Bangkok, London or Paris, CARP students have never hesitated to deal with controversial topics of the day. In the 1980s that was atheistic communism. In recent years, CARP has taken on the challenge of free sex and promiscuity and starting a new movement to resist the temptations of drugs, alcohol and immorality. In this new millennium, we have the opportunity to create a new start between the nations and cultures of the world. We have the chance to dream once again about the great ideal of achieving world peace, but we have to first address the basic social unit that gives us our social awareness; the family. We strongly believe that the creation of God-centered families will guide young people to strive for excellence as well as be more socially conscientious. It is from this point that we will find peace between races, cultures, genders, generations, and nations.

At the core of every CARP student's life is a dedication to God and a commitment to a life of serving others. We can be found on campuses around the world, sharing our belief and commitment with others. The goal of a college education is much more than financial gain, social recognition or mere acquisition of knowledge. We must first become good people and learn how to create good families.

As the keynote speaker of the Youth Festival, World CARP President Hyun Jin Moon will outline his exciting vision of World CARP's future as the Number One organization for young people committed to service for peace.

About WCSF

The wide range of plenary sessions, conferences and symposia presented at this convocation share a common vision and goal, namely the establishment of a world in which peoples, cultures, races, religions and nationalities live together in harmony, mutual respect, cooperation and universal prosperity. This vision of world peace is the basis for the overall theme of the Convocation of World Leaders: "Dialogue and Harmony Among Civilizations: The Family, Universal Values and World Peace." This theme will be explored by political leaders, religious leaders, academics, media professionals, artists and political leaders.

Achieving genuine peace requires an integrated, cross-disciplinary and collaborative effort. That is, peace cannot be established by politicians alone, or by academics alone, or by religious leaders alone. To overcome the tendency for peace efforts to be fragmented, Rev. Moon established the Interreligious and International Federation for World Peace (IIFWP).

Of particular concern to the IIFWP are two serious and growing problems. The first is family instability and breakdown, and the serious social, economic and cultural problems that the family's decline generates. The second is ethnic, racial and religious intolerance. IIFWP calls for political, religious and educational institutions to work together to solve both problems.

In the latter part of the year 2000, the IIFWP sponsored a series of educational programs in more than 180 nations dedicated to promoting strong families, character education, public service and interreligious and international cooperation. These programs and others are contributing to the creation of a global movement for peace, transcending the barriers of race, nationality, culture and religion.

When the Reverend and Mrs. Sun Myung Moon first presented their vision for the Festival, just after the Summer Olympics of 1988, they explained that the goals of international conflict resolution and world peace were at the very core of the Festival's purpose. As they stated in the founding declaration for the Festival, "There can only be a peaceful family of nations when you have nations of peaceful families."

To accomplish this purpose, it was decided to involve as wide a range of participants as possible, including men and women in all fields of endeavor: scholars, artists, religious leaders, scientists, statesmen, youth leaders and journalists. The magnitude of the world's problems challenges us to mobilize our united intellectual and spiritual resources to achieve constructive solutions.

World CARP gratefully acknowledges the tremendous support and inspiration it has gained from the WCSF and its founders, both in guiding its ongoing activities and in encouraging this event.
