Eastern Europe Youth Meet True Mother During Pilgrimage

Of the 129 people, primarily Second Generation, on the EUME special pilgrimage to Korea, a total of 26 came from Eastern Europe (11 from Shin Albania, 11 from Russia, 2 from Lithuania, and 1 each from Croatia and Romania). As part of their 21-day training, they attended programs at Cheongpyeong, including prayer vigils and a Special Great Works commemorating the anniversary of True Father's ascension. They also journeyed to Busan to visit the Rock of Tears. However, the highlight of the pilgrimage was lunch with True Mother on 1 September at the Cheon Jeong Gung. There they inspired True Mother by performing in Korean several songs that were written by Hyo Jin Nim.

Albanian VIPs Celebrate UPF's 18th Anniversary

Over 150 VIPs and Ambassadors for Peace filled the main hall of the Peace Embassy in Tirana on 12 September to celebrate the 18th anniversary of the founding of UPF. Among the VIPs were the ambassador of Kosovo to Albania, three current members of parliament, the deputy minister of tourism, two former ministers, and several former MPs. After a video about UPF's achievements around the world, there was a presentation about the 800 programs that UPF-Albania has held. At the end, 10 new Ambassadors for Peace were appointed, including one member of parliament and a famous tenor. — *Gani Rroshi*









Albanian Peace Council Joins Peace Day Event The UPF Peace Council in the northeast Albanian town of Dibër joined the organization of an International Day of Peace event in the nearby city of Peshkopi. ... Eleven years after his death, Dr Hasan Leka, one of the first Ambassadors for Peace in the region, was awarded the title of Honorary Citizen of Peshkopi. The event coincided with the 10th anniversary of naming a city school after Dr Leka. ... The first part of the program was held outdoors on the school premises with more than 150 teachers, students, Ambassadors for Peace, and others. Among the participants were the mayor of the city, the prefect, and the head of the district. There was a celebratory atmosphere, and many artists participated. ... The second part of the program took place in the city for about 100 people. Defrim Methasani, the chair of the Tirana Peace Council, who is a well-known journalist, moderated. An important part of the program was the explanation of the meaning of the International Day of Peace and the appointment of six respected figures of the region as Ambassadors for Peace. – *Gani Rroshi*

"The Family I Want" was the topic of WFWP-Albania's annual Youth Public Speaking Competition, which was held at the C.I.G. Peace Embassy in Tirana before an audience of about 50. The whole project was sponsored by Women's Federation for World Peace International.




Russia Commemorates True Father's Ascension

Estonia Remembers True Father's Life

Ambassadors for Peace and Estonian members gathered at the Tallin Embassy on 3 September to commemorate the 11th anniversary of True Father's ascension. The participants included a former member of parliament, a former adviser to the president, a university professor, members of the Estonian-Korean Cultural Association, and a married couple from Ukraine. After words of welcome from Avo Martinson, all the participants introduced themselves. A pianist and a dancer offered performances; True Father's life was explained through a video and a short talk; and one of the guests testified about being deeply moved by Father's autobiography. The program concluded with the Estonian-Korean Cultural Association performing two Korean songs, and Avo Martinson presenting True Father's autobiography to the former member of parliament. – Olga and Avo Martinson

Russian Peace Road Event Honours Peace Day In the Russian Far Eastern city of Vladivostok, the local chapter of UPF organized a Peace Road event to commemorate International Day of Peace. About 100 people took part in a run inside the Stroitel ("Builder") Stadium. Through the VKontakte social network, participants were invited by UPF, by the Iron Team Club, and by Ark, an interregional public organization for disabled people. Participants included mothers with special-needs children; schoolchildren with their parents; disabled adults; young and elderly people; and even athletes. The Primorsky Territory Triathlon and Polyathlon Federation, the Bostok company and the Primfood group of companies were sponsors of the program. ... After a short speech by Maria Sergienko, the local UPF representative, about the meaning of International Day of Peace and the Peace Road initiative, Dmitry Yakukhny, the head of the Iron Team Club, conducted warm-up exercises for all participants. Then everyone together counted down to the start, and after the signal they started moving! After the run finished, Mr. Yakukhny, himself an Ambassador for Peace, solemnly presented an Ambassador for Peace certificate to Alexander Ufilin for social activities in Vladivostok and the Primorsky Territory, for an active lifestyle and for improvement of public places. At the end of the event, Maria Sergienko presented Dmitry Yakukhny with a copy of True Mother's memoirs. – Maria Sergienko

Farewell to a Much Loved Sister, Kathrin Ladstätter

Kathrin Ladstätter, who was an underground missionary in the Soviet Union together with her husband, Peter, ascended on 19 September at the age of 65. Following are excerpts from the tribute that was read at her Seonghwa in Vienna on 24 September by her youngest child, Vera.









At the beginning of 1991, Kathrin and Daniel joined Peter in Moscow. As our movement began to work openly in Russia, Kathrin supported its activities, in addition to caring for her expanding family. After four more children—Natalia, Michael, Andi and Vera—the family returned in 2003 to Vienna, where Kathrin was involved in WFWP and helped at children's and HARP workshops. She later became a Second Generation matching supporter, showing much love and empathy.

In February of this year, Kathrin was hospitalised due to a mild stroke, and after further tests, in April it was discovered that she had bladder cancer, which already had spread. Kathrin took up the fight, completing four chemo cycles. She always kept a realistic view and positive thoughts. She was especially motivated by the birth of her first grandchild, a boy.

Despite all her efforts and the strength with which she went through life, her health deteriorated very badly in September. After a few days in the hospital, she was transferred to the palliative ward, and doctors confirmed that nothing more could be done for her. Peter cared for his wife devotedly during her illness and was there for her unconditionally. They were supported on their last journey by their children, who were with her every day in the hospital.

Kathrin's Seonghwa was attended by 130 people, with many others following the ceremony online, especially brothers and sisters in Russia. The testimonies spoke of Kathrin's devoted love not only for her own family but also for all the brothers and sisters around her. – the Ladstätter family
