They started each day with exciting activities to wake up, followed by short guidance. After the breakfast, they received 2 presentations by Co-Pastor Gregg Smith and Assistant Pastor Makiko Watanabe on basic principles and core values such as Living for the Sake of Others and Midway position geared towards a younger audience. Afternoon activities included water balloon fights and swimming, and a lot of board games. In the evenings, Tora Ota and Yoshiha Tsuchida were invited to share their personal testimonies and wisdom as experienced elder brothers.

Some of the participants usually are reluctant to attend regular church events; some are extremely shy. However, they enjoyed this experience of being together as a family. When he was getting picked up at the end of the camp, one middle school participant told his mom that he wished this camp was longer. Many parents expressed sincere gratitude for this type of opportunity for their children.
