Catherine said, "We are so grateful for everyone's prayers and concern. My whole family, including children and grandchildren, were affected. So it was very challenging and it is a long road to recovery. However, families that provided meals and encouragement has made it a little easier to bear."

Another way that people are supporting each other is through donating to The Lifeboat. The Lifeboat is a program set up independently by Unificationists in the community, where people can donate to help those in need. The Lifeboat will directly pay for a month's rent, or medical expenses, or whatever emergency arises, to alleviate an applicant's financial stress.

Providing meals for families in need is common in this community, whether someone is in the hospital with sickness, or just had a baby, or lost a family member. But in the age of coronavirus, when there is so little people can do for one another, making meals and contributing to The Lifeboat are two big things members can do to express their love.
