Ongoing Interfaith Work in Grand Junction



On March 30th, 2023 we held our monthly Interreligious Sharing program in Grand Junction. Our motto is, "We are all God's children. Let's build bridges of heart and respect among one another by sincerely learning about each other's faiths."

Ten people attended: 4 Bahai, 2 Latter-Day Saints, 2 Christian Scientists, and 2 WFWP/UPF representatives. Our interfaith outreach efforts have been going strong here in the Western edge of Colorado since June 2019. In January, we began a new mini-series entitled, "Celebrating our Spiritual Founders." We have learned about the Bab and Baha'u' llah of the Bahai faith and Mary Baker Eddy from the Christian Science Church. Last night at the Church of Jesus Christ of the Latter-day Saints, we were educated about their founder, Joseph Smith.

Everyone was so interested to understand the Latter-Day Saints' faith better, many questions were asked, lively discussion ensued and many participants expressed gratitude for our interreligious series which enables them to know the beliefs of other religions and denominations in a warm, accepting environment.

Each group shared who they are, what they stand for and how they serve the community. The women's groups that participated:

United Methodist Women of Faith: Bold action and strong faith in God' Love to improve the lives of women, children and youth.

Diaper Depot - a service program of the United Methodist Church that gives free diapers and diaper cream to families in need.

Catholic Daughters- "Unity and Charity" is their motto. They support the Catholic Church, the priests and charitable causes.

Women's Self-Defense: Teaches strategic moves to protect women from attackers, allowing them to get away safely.

The Relief Society of Jesus Christ of the Latter-day Saints: "Just Serve" an online platform that connects organizations that serve the community with people who are seeking to volunteer.

Red Hats- An organization that promotes taking care of each other and having fun!

Disciples Women of First Church of Christ: They are a compassion-focused mission of Jesus Christ. They hold an annual large tag sale to support the activities of their church. They study, pray and lift up one another. They serve the needy.

Black Student Alliance, Colorado Mesa University - Their mission is to establish a space where the voices of minority students are both heard and uplifted. They seek to educate the campus and surrounding communities on Black culture.

Women's Federation for World Peace - Rev. Moon and his wife, Dr. Hak Ja Han Moon established WFWP in 1992 because they understood women are natural

peacemakers. Mother Moon is calling for the power of true womanhood to affect peace in marriages, families, communities and out to many areas of the world. It is time for women leadership. Yet we love our men!

Thirty-three people attended. People were excited to meet and learn about other women groups in the area. Networking took place, flyers were exchanged, and everyone left with smiles on their faces.

Generation Peace Academy Family Workshop




