Interfaith Activities in Grand Junction



Two events are highlighted in this month's interfaith report from Grand Junction.

The first marked the 70th Anniversary of the Korean Armistice by gathering at the Korean War Memorial with representative members from City Hall.

Gale gave a short, but effective speech that covered the Korean War, Rev. Moon being incarcerated in a communist prison and then liberated by the American forces, the need to unite North and South Korea, and the meaning of Peace Road.

Antonio read aloud the names of the 16 nations that fought to drive out communism or donated supplies. We all took turns reading the names of the people from Fruita who died fighting in the Korean War, a war that took place just 5 years after WWII ended. We concluded with a prayer and tears.

The second event was a WFWP/Peace Road Prayer Breakfast. The theme was "Bridging the Black White Divide."

The First Christian Church not only hosted us, but cooked and served a hot, delicious breakfast. Thirty people attended: representatives from 5 different Christian churches, Baha'is, Black Citizens and Friends, the service organization, Diaper Depot, Grand Valley Interfaith Network as well as the mayor of nearby Palisade and the pastor of Crossroads Methodist Church.

Two young women from Black Student Alliance, an organization of Colorado Mesa University, presented on Black culture.

Afterward, we had an honest and open discussion among the somewhat racially mixed audience. We then created space for the 4 black women in attendance to honestly share their experiences of racism in the Grand Valley. They told us later they were happy because they felt heard and validated.




Divine Principle Education in Cameroon
