Foundation Day Pledge Service





Interreligious Sharing, February 22nd

Let me begin by saying that the photo of Antonio and I is terrible.

Beyond that, it was a wonderful program. All the participants gave well-prepared remarks on the topic, "What is Sin? And How do we Overcome it?" (2 Bah'ai representatives, Church of Jesus Christ of the Latter Day Saints Communication Director, Chaplain of the First United Methodist Church, Christian Science leader who sent his script to be read, and Antonio and I representing WFWP and UPF.)

Many of the faith leaders' and representatives' insights on the topic overlapped and some were unique to this group, such as our understanding of collective and hereditary sin, and our concept of fallen nature.

The United Methodist chaplain shared that John Wesley, their church's founder, advocated having a loving spiritual mentor to help members be accountable for their actions each week. This would help them not to sin.

The Bah'ais expressed that the holy rules of their faith were written by their founder, Baha'u' llah, to guide them to make wise spiritual choices and allow them to live in joy.
