### Rev. Moon Proclaims the Beginning of the Cheon Il Guk Era

True Father proclaimed Cheonju Pyeonghwa Tongil Guk (the Nation of Cosmic Peace and Unity), abbreviated as Cheon II Guk (CIG) on November 15, 2001. Cheon II Guk was the Unification equivalent of the Kingdom of Heaven and culminated Rev. Moon's ministry. The proclamation signified the fundamental shift in the order of salvation from the individual to the family, to now extend beyond the family and to the creation of the heavenly nation. Sang Ik "Papasan" Choi was the fourth of the Unification Church missionaries to arrive in the United States. He arrived in the San Francisco Bay Area on November 12, 1965 and set up numerous community-based organizations in the San Francisco Bay Area, which together culminated in the creation of the International Re-Education Foundation. This foundation tapped into the communal ethos and utopian idealism of the 1960s. ## November 10, 2011 Seonghwa for Dr. David S.C. Kim

Dr. David Sang Chul Kim, known by more than 1,000 graduates of the Unification Theological Seminary (UTS) as President Kim, was honored by True Father with a new name for his ascension service. It was the first-ever use of the term "Seong Hwa (Heavenly Harmony) Ceremony." "Since 1984, True Father designated the ascension ceremony for Blessed members as the Seung Hwa (昇華), but from today we will have Seong Hwa (聖和) ceremonies," said Dr. Chang Shik Yang, the Continental Director of the Unification Church at the time.
