First Victory Over Communism Asian Rally January 21, 1970, Seoul Citizen's Hall

The first Victory Over Communism Asian Rally was held in the afternoon of January 21, 1970, at the Seoul Citizen's Hall. Hosted by the International Federation for Victory Over Communism, this rally was held with success through the participation of more than six thousand anti-communist leaders from five different nations. The main address was delivered by Vietnam War veterans Shin Jo Kim and Ik Poong Kim.
