## True Parents' Visit North Korea November 30–December 7, 1991, Pyongyang, North Korea

True Parents arrived in Pyongyang on November 30, 1991, visiting by formal invitation of the North Korean government. They arrived at Sunan International Airport, where Chairman Yoon of the Committee for Peaceful Reunification of the Fatherland met them. During a press conference at the Beijing Capital International Airport VIP Room True Father said, "I hope that this visit will bring unification to the fatherland closer." They stayed at the Moran Bong Guest House in Pyongyang. On December 3, they visited Mt. Keumgang and on December 5 they visited Jeongju, True Father's hometown.
