PILOT PROGRAM REPORT

LOS ANGELES, CA JULY-AUGUST 2008



INTRODUCTION

We would like to give you a report of our activities here in Los Angeles over the past several weeks.

We are starting to break through on many levels - most importantly in bringing new guests, and bonding with the LA community. We have created the following programs which all have a certain niche, but serve the same purpose - to bring new guests through a system that will effectively touch their lives and bring them into a relationship with True Parents through the Divine Principle.

1. SUNDAY NIGHT COFFEE HOUSE AT THE MONROVIA COFFEE COMPANY

- We have had 4 successful Sunday night programs
 - 1st program brought 7 guests, all brought by local members (BCs and 1st Gen)
 - o 2nd program brought 8-9 guests
 - 3rd program brought 10+ guests, some brought by local members and several brought by our team. Many guests were locals passing through that we engaged in conversation about our other programs.
 - 4th program was packed. The coffee house was so full that many sat on the floor. At least 10 guests brought by the Pilot Team and the local members. Many others passed through and we engaged them in conversation.
- The Coffee House is a program designed by the Pilot Team, which has already been inherited by a local BC (Amy Cox)
- The purpose of the Coffee House is to advertise our other "Live and Give" programs: Service Projects, One-Day "Living Love" Relationship Seminar, One-Day "Path to Peace" Seminar, and Youth Sunday Service





- The Coffee House is becoming a successful partnered event with the Pilot Team and local community.
- The team is bringing several guests each week which we have met at the local college campuses and in tourist locations (such as the Getty Museum).
- Local BCs are also starting to feel comfortable to invite their friends.
- We are also meeting guests on the Internet, advertising the Coffee House through Craig's List.



2. Thursday Surf & Fishing Lessons (service project) with Jack Ashworth

- Brings Inner City Kids (Middle and High School) from Watts to the Beach and teaches them how to Surf and Fish
- Currently brings about 1 guest per week to help mentor the kids
- Considering the advice of several local BCs, we continue to believe that Service Projects can be a successful strategy for developing relationships with guests. The Pilot Team's current projects however, have not proven as successful as we would have liked. We believe this is probably due to the relative location of the service projects (Long Beach) we chose and their not-so-close proximity to where we were promoting them (Pasadena).





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3. FRIDAY AFTERNOON MENTORING AT THE WATTS BOYS & GIRLS CLUB

- Brings guests to mentor/make a difference in lives of Inner City Youth
- Currently brings about 1 guest per week
- Considering the advice of several local BCs, we continue to believe that Service Projects can be a successful strategy for developing relationships with guests. The Pilot Team's current projects however, have not proven as successful as we would have liked. We are working to make our service projects user friendly in terms of location and sheduling.



4. FRIDAY NIGHT EVENING INTRODUCTORY PROGRAM

- 2 Successful Programs so far
 - o 1st week brought 1 guest with whom we are developing relationship
 - 2nd week brought 3 guests 2 of whom committed to coming to our "Living Love" Relationship Seminar (the next level)
- The Evening Program is a social event (Barbecue, games, music) that promotes the "Living Love" Relationship Seminar and the "Path to Peace" Seminar (both are based on the Divine Principle).
- Evening Program uses various aspects of the Principle (such as Selfish Love vs. Unselfish Love) in Interactive ways
- Creates a community feeling with all participants



5. "Living Love" Relationship Seminar (Every other Saturday)

- 1 day seminar using DP framework (Fall Creation Restoration)
- Centered on Human Relationships
- 30 Attendees the first week (1 guest)
 - o guest was positive about the program
 - o Taught by Dan Stein
 - o Seminar was critiqued, analyzed and totally revamped for the 2nd week
- 10 Attendees the second week
 - o Received well by attendees
 - o Needs minor tweaks
 - o BCs encouraged by new method of presenting the Principle:
 - Not too ideological/theoretical
 - Uses "Discovery Method" to discover the Principle (4 Realms of Heart, e.g.)
 - Applies to Real life
 - Interactive style
 - Presented by Dave Hunter, Henri Schauffler, and Brett Moss (local member)

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6. Youth Sunday Service ("Parking Lot Church" = temporary name)

- 2 Successful Youth Driven, Music oriented Sunday Services
 - We want to make this our own Mega-Church
- Purpose is to be inviting to guests no use of internal UC language
- Services were organized by Vince and Miwa Aparo and supported by the Pilot Team
- Service was Music Focused (Wit. Summit Music), with live band led by Vince, Ares and other local UC youth
- The First Youth Sunday Service
 - Brought several BCs who "never" come to church
 - Sermon was given by Dave Hunter on "The Easiest Way to Experience God" (through our daily relationships), which was a natural advertisement for our "Living Love" Relationship Seminar
 - Collected \$231 in offering (all donated by BCs)




- The Second Youth Sunday Service
 - Brought one guest, who came with Ares Meyer (Ares also brought his parents)
 - Sermon was given by Uncle Tony Aparo on "Self-Mastery" which was a general way to teach the 1st Blessing, focusing on making ourselves God's Dwelling Place
 - Collected \$209 in offering (all donated by BCs)
- Both services were received very well by the local community The second service had an attendance increase of 50% (about 70 people, youth and adult)

- Program was received relatively well by the guests our team is yet to debrief this seminar





OUR CONCLUSIONS

During 2007-08 the national witnessing initiative created a nation wide enthusiasm for a witnessing strategy that was driven by a cooperative effort between first and second generation.

Findings:

Our results have been relevant based on our goals. We feel that our accomplishments will be immediately applicable to major witnessing projects as they emerge across the United States. We have already received inquiries from Boston, San Francisco, and other states requesting to use these programs and materials as soon as they are available.

- There are a number of short term priorities to continue the progress of the witnessing initiative
- Maintaining continuity of the pilot in LA which will require additional resources/manpower starting mid August
- The creation of a web outreach vehicle which is being initiated under the leadership of Jonathan Gullery with support from our second generation staff.

We feel strongly that the progress made thus far has been responsive to the direction and enthusiasm communicated by the six witnessing summits and we are confident that we are moving in the right direction and can fully accomplish our goals.

The next step is the creation of a national level capability to create and disseminate witnessing tools which is being established in NY under the leadership of Dave Hunter and Megan Simonds with support from our steering committee.

The steering committee is a committed high caliber group of Unificationists that have been functioning together effectively for one year. It continues to create the momentum which is allowing this project to evolve and develop the capacity needed to succeed. We look forward to your continuing support which is essential to the project's ongoing development.
