INTRODUCTION

Summer 2013 came at a crucial time; looking back to August 2012, so much has happened in the movement and the world. It was at the close of last summer that Father passed away, and we arrived at the start of this summer in a completely different internal landscape.

The motto of L*L*L – Pure is Beautiful gave us an anchor to focus on reinforcing Father’s key message for the Cheon Il Guk Era – in such an important time of transition and potential development, what can we hold onto?

What direction can we build the future upon?

We returned to El Manantial Del Corazon, our workshop site in Spain, to kick-off the summer activities with a staff training workshop on the 10th July. Then followed the SAWS 21+ Workshop, the 21 day Mobilisation, the Junior HARP workshop, the senior HARP workshop, the 12 day Divine Principle Workshop, and concluded on the 31st August with the ODP+ Workshop in Camberg.

Across the age groups – from Junior to 21+ we could engage with the motto in a way that made sense, and experience the clarity and richness of Father’s teachings. His mission as Messiah and 2nd Adam, to start a new lineage and a new tradition. How can we take responsibility and build upon this deep spiritual tradition? We were reminded

that God is not really interested in Money, Knowledge or Power - that we should not find our value there. Rather, he is much more concerned with Love, Life, and Lineage – and that is where our value lies. It was the shared experience of being together in which we could catch a glimpse of the meaning behind the motto.

Father worked to bring a substantial change in the world – and we are the fruits from that great love that has come through our parents. There is value in God’s lineage, our experiences confirm it – and we need to realise the potential we have to make a difference in the world, to mark a new shift and a new era. 12 DAY DIVINE PRINCIPLE WORKSHOP

We gathered in Dunajska Luzna, on the outskirts of Bratislava to devote 12 days to studying the Word together. The first part of the workshop consisted of the 7 Day Divine Principle content taught by Rev. David Hanna. The 7 day content took us by the hand on a journey through each chapter of the Exposition of the Divine Principle in chronological order. In this way it was presented as a story – our story – and us as 2nd Generation as the fruits and result of this, the most recent chapter in God’s story. This exploration of our story – that of the ideal and restoration, that of the providential figures who purified the lineage and laid the foundation, connected us to the summer Motto of L*L*L – Pure is Beautiful in a very deep way.
