
WFWP USA: GWPN presents All My Relations: Our Universal Connection

During our virtual live edition on Inner Crisis & Resolution, Dr. Santos will be sharing from the Native American perspective on our connection with nature and our overall well-being, on topic "All My Relations: Our Universal Connection."

Dr. Cornelia Santos (Apache, Navajo, and Pueblo) graduated with her doctorate from the University of Colorado, where she was the first Native American to graduate from the School of Educational Leadership in Denver, Colorado. After graduation she was appointed as a post-doctoral fellow at the university's Centers for American Indian and Alaskan Native Health (CAIANH). Prior to that, she spent time as a research consultant and as a researcher for Native American Cancer Research, Native American Cancer Initiatives and Denver Public Health.

She has an interdisciplinary focus with degrees in Biology, Chemistry, and Environmental Science. She is currently a professor of Environmental and Indigenous Studies at Bemidji State University where she combines the wisdom of Indigenous Knowledge with her approach to Environmental Studies. Many of her projects draw on her expertise in these areas and on the improvement of the health and welfare of the earth.
