
WFWP USA: Support WFWP's fundraiser - Shine Africa - the Power of Education

Our support has certainly produced positive results. Thousands of children have received quality education with free or very low tuition. Among them, many could get jobs, and some even study abroad.

Unfortunately, due to the COVID pandemic, our schools were damaged severely. In many countries we needed to close schools under lockdown. The damages were beyond our imagination. The lives of not only students but also teachers and staffs were in danger because we couldn't pay the salary for teachers.

Moreover, for some children, they can only eat meals when they come to school. Soaring building material prices affected school construction.

I'm sure you all have faced tremendous difficulties; however, the situation of African countries is incomparable that of us. Your contributions will brighten the future of the children of Africa. Let us support the schools of Africa in the spirit of "We are One Family under God".
