St. Paul writes to the people in Ephesus and Crete with a concern to maintain the faith and to ensure the continuity of the Church of Jesus Christ.

II Timothy 1:12-13 "For which cause I also suffer these things, nevertheless I am not ashamed for I know whom I have believed and am persuaded that he is able to keep that which I have committed unto him against that day" "Hold fast the form of sound words which thou hast heard of me in faith and love which is in Christ Jesus." "That good thing which was committed unto thee keeping by the Holy Ghost which dwelled in us." St. Paul is encouraging his people not to give up.

As I count, more than 40 names have passes. But not just names, they were our friends and family. We cared for them. Many of these I actually conducted their funeral.

Over the years, I have come to understand loyalty, dedication and not giving up whether to my wife, to my children, my neighborhood, mission, community. Over the years I have come to value consistency in adversity through the MLK JR. Program, MADV, 9-11 as well as projects through the task Forces, Elks Lodge and other groups. In short, not giving up nor being discouraged even in tough times.

I believe in the end people respect you not so much for what you believe in but what kind of person you

become. They will hold in regard not on your words but your deeds, your investments.

As I was looking through my old address book, I found an old letter from my son tucked away in the back. He wrote, on Oct. 8, 2007 to the Yakawich Family. He was writing from Wisconsin out fundraising on a mission aka Student Task Force.

"I guess I would like to share some words of wisdom. How do we grow to become better people? If we are always in our comfort zone taking it nice and easy can one grow? No, we have to endure pain and suffering. In other words, in order for us to fulfill our purpose of creation and find our original value we have to struggle. It is unavoidable.

Heavenly Struggle is only as bad as you look at it. When you can learn from it then it is good struggle that brings accomplished me and joy. But if you don't have a positive attitude about it and complain, then it is painful, depressing and brings unhappiness.

So embrace struggle and use it to help you grow. Learn from it and in that way you can truly see your accomplishments.

Where does value come from? Value comes from sacrifice and investment. Never do things just to get it done, but give your whole heart into it. If you do things without heart then in a sense you have wasted a portion of your life. Give everything 100% investment and heart and each moment of your life will be valueable. Clean your room because you don't want it to be dirty and so you don't get sick. Mow the lawn because you want to work hard and sweat and lose weight. Study hard so that you can be able to teach others.

Crazy right. If you want to be happy you have to struggle. Always remember to keep a positive attitude and find joy."

His letter helped me explore the value of dogged determination! Not giving up, investment. As St. Paul's letter wanting to encourage his people. He wanted to uplift and support them not to give up.

Finally, I am reminded on this day of the Super Bowl how much these football players invested. Just like each of you to be good in a sport, a career, a talent or gift, you practiced and did not give up. As some are going to college or had gone to college. It is tough. Yet, in not giving up they will succeed to become better and look back with gratitude that they did not give up.

Pace yourself, prayer and reflection: Finding their peaceful place. Even taking a walk around the neighborhood.

Serve others, volunteer: Something about the guy who tackles another but stays by to give him a helping hand. Take a walk around the neighborhood and picking up litter! May you find your spirit of not giving up in all you do? Invest for it is always worth it.
