

Second Generation Start Global Future Leadership Training

Second-generation youth entering Ukraine's Global Future Leadership program attended a kick-off workshop from August 23 to 25 before starting a 40-day fundraising condition.

Having 20-years' experience of conducting the New World Educational Team, a one-year program for young first-generation members, the Ukrainian members decided to open a similar one-year educational program for the second generation. They call this program Global Future Leadership (GFL). Starting next year, Ukrainian second-generation young people will enter GFL after they graduate from high school.

This year, 12 applications came from second-generation young people from Korea, Japan, Africa and Belarus. Nine of them took part in the kick-off workshop in Kiev, and the other three attended a similar program in Korea. The three-day workshop focused on fundraising as a preparation for a 40-day condition in Europe.



One of the participants wrote the following reflection: "Hoon Dok Hwe at the workshop was so precious for me. Until now, I was just reading, but here we had a chance to deeply discuss the contents. Through these three days, I realized why we need to do Hoon Dok Hwe.
