Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Yesterday morning, our brother Hideyuki Maeda passed into the spiritual world. Our Chicago community is now proud to join together with his precious family to celebrate his life and support his new birth in the eternal world.

Mr. Hideyuki did not have any physical problem except for a chronic back pain until the morning of his ascension. His wife Sadako found that he had made the peaceful transition while he was sleeping. His sudden ascension surprised his family and our community; however we believe that, because of True Parents' immeasurable grace in the Age after the Coming of Heaven, he can become an Absolute Good Sprit and will protect and guide his family and our community from now on.

Mr. Hideyuki Maeda was born on March 11 in 1959 in Hokkaido, Japan. In 1981 he joined Unification Church in Nagoya. In 1984 God called him to America to support True Parents' ocean providence. He had worked hard for various ocean companies and organizations such as restaurants, New York Fish House and the Ocean Church. Later he moved to Ohio and had engaged in the Japanese grocery business and since 1998 he and his family have lived in Chicago.

In 1989 he was matched with Miss Sadako Imamura by True Parents and joined the 1275 couple Blessing ceremony. They raised 2 sons and 1 daughter Hidesada (21), Kensei (16) and Miyuki (18). A third son Kiyokuni was offered to a Japanese Blessed couple who did not have a child.


