He studied to become a Jesuit Priest and joined the Unification Church in 1973

After the Blessing in 1978 he moved to Korea where he taught French language.

He started to teach Philosophy as well so he did his Under Graduate studies, the Master Degree in Oriental philosophy. He finally obtained his PhD in Philosophy in 1992. He taught Oriental philosophy in the USA in 1995.

Philippe taught Korean philosophy through Korean in Seoul at Konkuk University and then Hanyang University.
