Update on Dr. Kone's Naval Involvement

About a year and a half ago there was some nervousness about hiring this tall, dark and handsome man from the Ivory Coast as our pastor. But it didn't take long for us to realize that he is not only a scholar and a committed husband and father but also a man of deep faith who demonstrates his faith with his life choices.

Quite frankly I am reminded of certain other historical figures who made what seemed to those around them to be startling and sudden life changing decisions, some of which had significant impact on God's providence.

If you know something of Dr. Kone's course since coming to Belvedere you may guess that I am referring to his interactions with the US Navy's Chaplain's department. This article is to serve as an update on that situation and allow us to pray more effectively for him and his family.

After his initial 2011 application to become a Navy Chaplain and subsequent rejection while at UTS, the Navy recontacted him shortly after his arrival at Belvedere asking him to renew his application. Then after some serious prayer, reflection and further discussion with the Council, he accepted their offer but only for a Reserve commitment. His primary reason for not going for a full time position was so that he could continue to serve as our Pastor. Dr. Kone has discussed this with the Council and has agreed to serve the remainder (and hopefully more!) of his 3year term until September 2018.

He recently heard from the Navy that at present they mostly need to fill full-time positions and confirmation of his acceptance into the Reserve program is now pending.

I believe that we are extremely fortunate to have a great Pastor who is willing to do whatever it takes to follow God's calling. I hope that his example encourages you, as it does me, that God is close at hand and ready to support whatever initiative we undertake in the building of Cheon II Guk.
