UPF Salzburg, Austria: UN Peace Day Lecture - Peace Activist Bertha von Suttner

Salzburg, Austria. Like in the past years, I held several lectures in my home village south of Salzburg. Though there was no possibility to make any public announcement due to the pandemic, besides the regular also new guests come. The first two lectures attracted over twenty guests each and were based on my book Children of Cain; the contents were similar to my online lectures.

The third lecture (16 people) highlighted the Female Qualities of God and was held jointly with the philosopher Herbert Giller from Vienna. The fourth lecture (12 people) was dedicated to Bertha von Suttner who was the first woman to receive the Nobel Peace Prize (1905). Baroness Bertha was born in 1843 - exactly 100 years earlier than True Mother. Around 1900 she was voted as the most noted woman in the world! She wrote thousands of articles and gave hundreds of speeches in many countries including America where she was called the Angel of Peace.

Since the UN International Peace Day was close at hand, Klaus Riedl explained his wife's Network of Peace in Salzburg and other WFWP related work of Elizabeth who died in 2017. Some of the listeners received Father's autobiography which Elisabeth had bought but was unable to distribute. The wrapped books carried her name.
