



General Policy and Guidelines:

Do treat others and the creation around you just as you like to be treated; with courtesy, respect and friendliness. Please leave the cabins, bathrooms and grounds as you found them, clean and in good order. Please wash feet if muddy prior to entering cabins or bathroom (helps the septic system). Please conduct yourself with wholesomeness, integrity and helpfulness. Have a great time!

Do Not injure or mark on any facility, equipment, tree or stone. No guns or other weapons (including bows, slingshots, spear guns, pellet guns etc.). No cutting, breaking limbs from or carving on trees (may cause oak wilt disease). No trout lines. Smoking is prohibited in all rooms and facilities. No Drugs. No Alcohol (limited to special events IE weddings & by permission only). **NO FIRES** except in designated areas. No “playing” with matches.

Things to Bring: Sun tan lotion, water shoes, cap, insect repellent, first aid kit, flash light, towels, bedding, toiletries, binoculars, telescope, camera, bathing suit, floatation gear, mask-snorkel & fins, long pants and good shoes for hiking, water bottles.

Behavior Issues: Violation of camp rules may result in the expulsion of those involved. It is the right of the owner to determine and handle such matters.

Conservation: Cabins and Dorm Rooms are well insulated and require minimal use of air conditioners. So please turn them off once cool, whenever you leave the room and before bed. Please turn off all lights when not in use. Please conserve water and carefully put compost, recyclables and trash in the receptacles as marked.

Precautions: Tejas Trails is a natural environment as well as a working ranch. It includes cliffs, deep water, barbed wire fences, rugged terrain and diverse plant and animal life. Do not attempt to play with, feed or provoke the abundant wildlife. Take precaution for pests such as fireants, mosquitoes etc. Avoid walking in high grass and weeds. Do not reach blindly under logs or stones. Be aware that the numerous cliffs have no guardrails. There is no lifeguard on duty. Cross through the low-water crossing slowly and cautiously. Guests must take responsibility for their own as well as their children’s safety. Please notify staff of any personal injury, dangerous condition, broken utility or other problem.

Camp Structures: The Barn/Workshop area, Recording Studio, Main Hall, Residences etc are off limits unless specifically stated. Please return found items to “lost and found”. Your comments and suggestions are greatly appreciated
