UPF-Pakistan commemorated the UN International Day of Peace 2017

Multan, Pakistan -- UPF-Pakistan commemorated the UN International Day of Peace 2017 by coorganizing a seminar on "Together for Peace: Respect, Safety and Dignity for All" with the Multan Chamber of Commerce and Industry (MCCI). The event took place on September 21, 2017 in the conference hall of MCCI's building in Multan, a city located in Punjab province.

Among the 200 attendees were Mr. Khawaja Muhammad Usman, provincial minister of commerce and trade, and former president of the MCCI; Mr. Mughees Ahmed Sheikh, president of the MCCI; Mr. Gulzar Ahmed, a retired officer of the Pakistan Army; Ms. Ammara Ghufran, president of the South Punjab Women Chamber of Commerce and Industry; and Mr. Makhdoom Syed Wajahat Hussain Gillani, a religious leader in Pakistan.
