Reflecting On My Dad



Today, June 20th, is my parents' anniversary and in two days, it will be the one-year anniversary of my father's passing. Since this past Sunday was Father's Day, I

have been reflecting on his impact on my life. When I was young, I took for granted the many ways that he shared his love--fixing broken toys, making pancakes every Monday breakfast on his day off as a pastor, taking us camping every summer, building bunkbeds, a sturdy swing set and an A-frame playhouse and more. Building things with his hands was a skill that he learned in college working on a carpenter crew. Throughout his life, building things and gardening was a kind of therapy, a break from the stresses and challenges that come with the role of a pastor. A more recent example of his care and dedication to finding a solution to a challenge came from figuring out how to get a family cedar chest from his home in Virginia to California where I live.

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
