









Chapter 7
Everything is Created in Pairs

This lesson will:

- Highlight the fundamental Principles of Peace: 1) the Dual Purpose Principle, and 2) the Pair System Principle while explaining more fully the second one.
- Explain the important relationship between the two principles.
- Explain how human beings can complete or fulfill these principles within the family unit through honoring parents, which we call “filial heart.”


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1.		<p><i>PUBLISHER’S NOTE TO PRESENTERS:</i></p> <p><i>This is an exposition of the main themes of a true love character education curriculum. It is a blueprint for subjects and positions educators should use in presenting these themes in a way appropriate to the target age group.</i></p>
2.		<p>We begin our discussion of conjugal love, the love between husband and wife, by reviewing what we’ve learned about the fundamental principles of peace.</p> <p>If you want to be an architect, an electrician, a civil engineer, or a professional in any area, you first need to know the basic principles operating in that given field. That is why you go to school, take tests, and get a license.</p> <p>Life too has principles. We need to know them and live by them in order to realize the full meaning and purpose of life. When we live a life of goodness, we will have love, peace and so much more.</p>
3.		<p>There are two Universal Principles of Peace. They are:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) The “Dual Purpose” Principle. This is the essence of goodness. 2) The “Pair System” Principle. This is the essence of true love.
4.		<p>The first Principle of Peace is the mind-body principle. It is also called the “Dual Purpose” Principle. This was discussed in previous chapters. There are two purposes within each of us. The mind’s purpose is to live for others, and the body’s purpose is to take care of oneself.</p> <p>Both are necessary and good, and they work together seamlessly when we keep them in the proper order by putting the mind’s purpose first.</p>

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5.		<p>The relationship between mind and body is vertical, because the mind is more public and the body more private. Also the mind is up and the body is down. The vertical relationship of mind and body is the essence of goodness since the right alignment is made when <i>we live for the sake of others</i> more than for ourselves.</p> <p>Children begin the road to maturity by honoring their parents. This aligns the public-private or mind-body relationship with the correct priority. Public responsibilities are given priority over private concerns. On this foundation virtues such as integrity, honesty, truthfulness, and trust are created.</p>
6.		<p>The second Principle of Peace is horizontal in nature. It is the relationship between men and women. In this relationship men and women have equal value. They are not above and below; they are on the same level.</p> <p>How is it that they are actually equal? Let's look at it mathematically.</p>
7.		<p>It is evident in the conception of children that the father and mother are equal. Every child has 23 chromosomes from each parent, thus making a total of 46 chromosomes.</p> <p>The origin of life begins with conjugal love. Our parents loved each other before we were conceived. Thus, conjugal love precedes existence. This love is the essence of and origin of a person and, therefore, the root of our identity.</p>
8.		<p>Man and woman are also equal in that they equally need each other in order to find fulfillment and happiness in life. So in the conception of children, and in the value of interpersonal relations, men and women stand as equals.</p> <p>After that they should be different, and they are. Typically, the father's love is stricter and the mother's is more embracing. Research verifies what common sense tells us: for children to grow up properly they need both kinds of love. A healthy society and nation reflects both masculine and feminine kinds of love, creativity, wisdom, beauty and so forth.</p> <p>This is also the essence of True Love because the love created <i>equally</i> by a man and woman is the glue that binds a husband and wife together. As equals, the man-woman relationship is horizontal in nature.</p>
9.		<p>Using the building metaphor, we can say the first Universal Principle, the mind-body relationship, is the "pillar." The second Universal Principle, the man-woman relationship, is the "beam."</p>




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10.		There are two components essential to the structure of a building: the pillars and beams.
11.		When you combine vertical and horizontal together, then the basic structure is formed. This is the unchanging, internal structure of a building. You can put the windows and doors wherever you want, but you cannot change the pillars and beams. The building can have many purposes: an office, a shopping center, an apartment building, a school, etc. But, to repeat, the pillars and beams cannot change regardless of the function of the building.
12.	 <small>Imploding a Building / India</small>	The pillars and beams create the framework of the building. If they are removed, the building collapses; it implodes. This is also true for families, societies, nations and the world. If the pillars and beams are removed, families collapse, societies and nations collapse and ultimately the world order collapses.
13.		The relationship between men and women is a relationship of equals and, therefore, is horizontal in nature. It is a partnership of shared value.
14.		Actually, all things in creation from atoms to elephants, are created in pairs. That's why this is called a principle of nature. The pair system is taught in basic science. Particles have positive and negative charges. Atoms have protons and electrons. And molecules are cations or anions.
15.		Many ask, What about the neutron? The neutron is a subatomic particle with no net electric charge and a mass slightly larger than that of a proton. ¹ In the neutron, the positive and negative charges have been united. We can say there are married. Neutrons stabilize the atomic structure and they are only found in the nucleus, the center of atoms.
16.		Next, in the plant world the pair system is within each flower called the stamen (the male part) and pistil (the female part). Honey bees, butterflies and birds are attracted by the color, fragrance or pattern of a flower's petals. When they come to get the nectar or pollen, the flower is pollinated. This produces the seeds for the next generation which allows the species to exist through reproduction.

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17.	<p>Plants: stamen & pistil</p> 	When we examine a flower casually we notice five external differences: color, size, shape, texture, and fragrance. Each flower is unique in this way. But flowers also have two things in common: they have a stamen and pistil. Most plants generally have both the stamen and pistil together in each flower. Some, however, have them separated either as two flowers on the same plant or two separate plants.
18.	<p>Dual Characteristics</p> 	Moving up in complexity, the pair system in animals consists of male and female.
19.	<p>Animals: male & female</p> 	The lion and the lioness (lions). The buck and the doe (deer). The cow and the bull (cattle). Orangutan, meerkats, rabbits, raccoons, sea lions, penguins, herons, ducks, parrots, puffins, damselflies, horse flies, lady bugs...
20.	<p>Dual Characteristics</p> 	Human beings are also created according to this principle.
21.	<p>Humankind: men & woman</p> 	Humankind, on every continent, is composed of men and women.
22.	<p>Dual Characteristics</p> <p>Why?</p> 	We can see that polarity, a system of complementary pairs, is universal. What does this tell us?
23.	<p>Dual Characteristics</p> <p>1. Existence itself requires polarity.</p> <p>2. The Origin of the universe has polarity.</p> 	First, it tells us that the existence itself requires polarity—plus and minus, male and female. Secondly, since all things in creation have a dual nature, it tells us that the Origin of the universe also has a masculine and feminine nature.

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24.		<p>[Click] The purpose of the pair system is for existence. The atom exists based on the interaction of protons and electrons. They need each other to exist and if you separate the protons from the electrons the atom no longer exists. Molecules are the same. The attraction between the cations (+) and anions (-) brings the particles together and creates an ionic compound, such as sodium chloride (NaCl).</p> <p>[Click] In the plant world, the purpose of the pair system includes existence which is carried out through reproduction. When the pollen from the stamen (male part) fertilizes the pistil (female part) then the seeds for the next generation are produced. Scientists have explained, “The biological function of a flower is to effect reproduction...”²</p> <p>[Click] Animals have offspring based on the mating of the male and female in a species. Live offspring are conceived through sexual reproduction. This is the purpose of the pair system of male and female animals. This is the same as the principle of existence found in the molecular world and reproduction found in the plant world, but it is of a higher order.</p> <p>[Click] Then what is the purpose of the pair system in human beings? It will include existence, reproduction and having offspring (i.e. children). Importantly, the man-woman pair in human beings must build on this and add something more. There should be a unique purpose for human sexuality that is more than having children, reproducing and existing.</p> <p>Human sexuality will, of course, include the purpose of the pair system of protons and electrons (existence), of stamen and pistil (reproduction), and the male and female in the animal world (offspring). But there must be, in addition, something special and distinctive. If this unique purpose cannot be identified, then human beings could easily just act like animals—sexually speaking.</p> <p>Sex for us is obviously not an animal function, in that it is not solely for the purpose of multiplication and dormant otherwise.</p>

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25.		<p>Father and Mother Moon teach a noble and exalted view of sex. Mother Moon put it this way,</p> <p style="text-align: center;">We marry in order to resemble God. God exists as a being of dual characteristics. Thus, husband and wife... together are a reflection of His original image...</p> <p>The universal pair system means that a man and a woman need each other to exist and to be complete. A man cannot be fully man without a woman. He cannot be a husband without a wife, and he cannot be a father without a mother. Similarly, a woman cannot be a wife without a husband, and she cannot be a mother without a father. Each needs the other to resemble our Heavenly Parent, or Creator, and be perfected.</p>
26.		<p>In the creative process, the invisible nature of an artist appears in the visible form of his or her work of art. So we can know about artists by examining their artworks. This is also true in each of us. The mind is invisible, but its nature, character and emotional status—our feelings and well-being—are made visible through the body.</p> <p>We can therefore know that because everything in the created world exists in a pair system, so also the original nature of the Creator, though one and unseen, must also have masculine and feminine attributes. This is why we use the term, “Heavenly Parent.”</p>
27.		<p>The union of man and woman is not just for the purpose of the existence of the human species by reproducing offspring, though it accomplishes that. It is to perfect ourselves through true love so that man and woman together reflect the nature of the universe and of our Heavenly Parent.</p> <p>This will be explained more fully in the next chapter.</p>
28.		<p>To review, there are two universal Principles of Peace.</p> <p>[Click] The principle of mind-body harmony is to <i>live for the others</i>. This is the essence of goodness because it gives priority to public-mindedness. Setting the right order is our first responsibility.</p> <p>Applying this principle in the man-woman relationship creates true love and teaches us the <i>sacredness of marriage</i>. This is our second responsibility.</p>

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29.		<p>When the principle of <i>living for the sake others</i> is applied to the man-woman relationship, it becomes, <i>loving for the sake of others</i>.</p> <p>Creating goodness within us and creating true love between a husband and wife are unique to human beings. These are our two special responsibilities and they differentiate us from the rest of creation.</p> <p>[Click] This is why the institution of the family is so essential. Both fundamental Principles of Peace are experienced and learned here. When the good character and true love learned in the family are integrated in society, we will have sustainable peace and co-prosperous development.</p>

Why? 	<p>Questions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • How can man and woman be equal? <u>Answer:</u> It is in conceiving children that the father and mother are equal. Every child has 23 chromosomes from each parent, thus making a total of 46 chromosomes. Men and women stand as equal partners in the creation of a new life. They also stand as equal partners in creating true love. Each has responsibility to live for the sake of the other. Only then can true love be created. • Which is more fundamental, the "Dual Purpose" Principle or the "Pair System" Principle? Why? <u>Answer:</u> Both are necessary and good. That said, the "Dual Purpose" Principle is more fundamental. Here are some reasons: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) When the mind and body are aligned correctly, it creates good character. 2) Love can be either moral (good) or immoral (bad). Since the "Dual Purpose" Principle sets the standard of goodness, it is more essential. Love for the sake of others is good. Love for the sake of myself is bad. 3) Being good is something each one of us must do, regardless of whether we are a man or woman. In other words, gender is of secondary importance to good character. 4) In construction the pillars are first and the beams are second. And the weight of the building rests on the pillars, not the beams. For example, the trunk (pillar) is bigger than the branch (beam).
