

The Mountain of the Lord

Isaiah 2:2-4 (re-read at beginning of sermon)

- I. “The Mountain of the Lord”
 - A. It means the highest spiritual level, where all mankind can meet the Lord.
 1. “the highest of the mountains”
- II. “All the nations shall flow to it”
 - A. The time has come to break down all the barriers in mankind.
 1. Certainly all Christians must unite into one body of Christ.
 - a. Let’s look for the commonalities, not differences, between ourselves as Christians
 2. Based on one body of Christians, the Lord will bring together all the world.
 - a. “And all nations shall flow to it...”
 - b. Together as one body of Christ, Christians can embrace all races and peoples and teach them the love of God in Christ.
 - i. God loves all His children – all faiths, races, cultures, nationalities.
- III. “The Word of the Lord...that He may teach us His ways and we may walk in His paths...”
 - A. When all Christians united into one body of Christ, we can “walk in His ways and in His path.”
 1. Together, we can serve the world.
 - a. (Talk about NCCSA or IOWC.)
 - b. Show the love of God in Christ in reality.
- IV. Finally, what is God’s ultimate plan as expressed in these verses?
 - A. “They shall beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks, and nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more.”
 - B. God’s goal = peace on earth.
 1. “Thy Kingdom come, They Will be done, on earth, as it is in Heaven...”
