Seminars and Conferences

Seminary Scholarship Program



A great member benefit (worth as much as \$21,000 in tuition and fee) is the scholarship program for advanced education, available to qualified applicants on a limited basis. ACLC believes in investing in its clergy through the degree programs at Unification Theological Seminary. These NY State-accredited Master of Religious Education (MRE) and Master of Divinity (Mdiv.) Degree programs offer students the theological, biblical and ministerial knowledge and skill they need to fulfill their calling effectively.

Middle East Peace Initiative



The ACLC is one of the founding organizations of the Middle East Peace Initiative (MEPI) and continues to organize pilgrimages to the Holy Land to allow pastors to engage in real peace making. Our spiritual roots are strengthened as we visit the holy sites and retrace the steps of Jesus and extend the call for Muslims, Christians and Jews to become active participants in the Middle East Peace experience

Fellowship and Prayer Breakfasts



The ACLC network of 20,000 pastors is established in all 50 states and most major cities. All chapters conduct Prayer Breakfasts on a monthly basis, providing opportunities for pastors to develop their call to be evangelists to the Nation. Almost every week there is an ACLC Prayer Breakfast somewhere in America.

Strengthening of Marriage and Family



The ACLC is on the cutting edge of establishing the pastoral role in pre- and post-marital counseling. This ministry comes from Matthew 19:4-6, which says that "What God has joined together, let no man put asunder."
