The Washington Times Foundation, established in 1984 by Rev. Sun Myung Moon, is a not-for-profit organization devoted to encouraging the highest ideals in cultural standards and public mindedness.

To achieve its mission, the Foundation sponsors programs in support of four major goals: (1) world peace, (2) religious and racial harmony, (3) restoration of the stable two-parent traditional family, and (4) community service.



The American Family Coalition

The American Family Coalition is a national grassroots leadership organization building alliances in all 50 states with community and faith-based organizations and policymakers.

Our mission is to renew American families and communities through education based on God's ideal of the family, model public policies, and faith-based action embodying the principle of living for the sake of others.

The American Family Coalition's core objectives are: to strengthen marriages and achieve a measurable reduction in divorce rates through the application of family education and positive family policies; to measurably reduce youth violence and other high-risk behaviors such as sexual promiscuity and suicide through enhanced parenting, youth leadership, character education and positive role model initiatives; and to promote faith-based community building initiatives to address addictions and other social issues.



National Congress of Black Women

The National Congress of Black Women (NCBW), formerly The National Political Congress of Black Women, was founded August 2, 1984 in Washington, D.C. when the Honorable C. DeLores Tucker called a group of 35 African American women leaders of diverse groups to organize for greater involvement in the political process.

NCBW is non-partisan and is the first organization that has its primary mission the political empowerment of African American women through the following activities:

- (1) identify, elect and act as mentors to African American women;
- (2) encourage African American women without regard to party affiliation, to engage in political activities, the first of which is registering to vote;
- (3) other training to African American women in understanding and operating within the political process;
- (4) encourage African women to seek office at all levels of government and encourage the appointment of African American women at all government levels;
- (5) develop and advocate public policy positions at every level of government, and
- (6) prepare African American females under 18 years of age to enter the political process.

The National Congress of Black Women has turned the spotlight on African American women and has ushered in an era of unprecedented growth, that signals the ensuing empowerment of African American women through the 21st Century and beyond.
