

EDITOR'S NOTE

The Unification Church was founded in 1954 in Seoul, South Korea by Rev. Sun Myung Moon. Described by one writer as "probably the fastest growing faith in the world," it has in the past two years begun to make a remarkable impact in America. The growth and accomplishments of the Church are regarded by many as phenomenal.

In conjunction with the Church's remarkable growth, periodic flurries of criticism have come our way, particularly by those who have perceived us as a threat. On the other hand, there are those who have expressed their support for the Church in both words and letters. They have spoken of their sense of the value which the Church and its members have for America. For all of us in the Church, these expressions have been tremendously inspiring and uplifting. Indeed, they have proved so supportive of the

ideals, qualities and work of the Church, that we decided to print those which were written. The result is this book.

The book has two sections. The first contains passages from the letters, excerpted according to certain themes. The second section consists of a brief introduction to Rev. Moon and several of the works which he has initiated. The entire letters are contained in the Appendix.

Through these letters, we want to introduce you to the Unification Church. They speak of an exceptionally bright hope in a darkening world. As you read them, I hope that you too will sense the vision and the hope which we are trying to share.

TO INSPIRE THE NATION


In the history of every nation there is rise and fall. Sometimes a nation reaches a peak of its culture, and sometimes it declines. Everyone wants to be proud of his own nation, his own culture or tradition. But are even those high points of culture up to the standard that we can be proud of throughout all eternity and before all humanity?

Sincere Christians today pray earnestly and strive to lead a life of faith in order to insure their own salvation. That has required the full effort of Christians. Once their own salvation is secure then Christians try to save their families. We are accustomed to doing that much, but not far beyond that. We did not realize that if we really struggled to win our nation under God's will, our families and ourselves would be included in the scope of that salvation. By setting our goal at a higher standard and pursuing a broader scope, lesser levels would be already included as saved. Today Christianity is declining in the world, and this is the cause. Christians have not restored nations as the solid foundation on which God can work.

What is God's desire and our desire? That is to restore the nation which God can claim to be His. In order for us to be able to do that, we must eliminate the evil condition. At all costs, even at the expense of ourselves, we must establish the kingdom of God on earth. We are living for that purpose. The whole earth will be our country. In God's sight there are no national boundaries. We have to unify the whole world under God's will. With all those people in cooperation with each other, we are going to build God's kingdom on earth. To do that is your mission as well as mine.



ON OUR FOREIGN MEMBERS

Over seven hundred members of the Church have come to America in order to work and be trained here. Each one goes through an initial training program at "Belvedere", our International Training Center in Tarrytown, N.Y.

A major part of the training involves theoretical study in three areas:

- The Divine Principle, a comprehensive teaching which emphasizes the principles and ideals of God's work in history and the present day.
- Unification Thought, a new system of thought which attempts to integrate religion, science and philosophy in several areas of traditional study.
- Critique of Communism, an understanding which opens the way to ideological victory over Communism.

A second aspect of the training involves practical experience in group leadership, witnessing, teaching, and fund raising. After trainees have received adequate exposure to both theory and practice, they are generally sent out to various parts of the nation where they engage in all aspects of Church work. Thus they both contribute to the work and receive on-the-job training.

In this way, the Church has people from many nationalities working side by side. Indeed, there are currently people from 25 different countries working here. International understanding and goodwill are thus cultivated. As this program expands and is transported to other countries, we will truly develop international citizens for an international age.


FINANCING OUR WORK




To support our programs, we have needed financial support. Without money, our hands are tied. Indeed, if we had more money, we would do more work.

The central source of financing for the American Church has been the door-to-door sales of small items—such as flowers, candles, granariums and peanuts. Carried out on a large scale, with many people devoting much legwork and long hours, we have been able to finance the many programs the Church has undertaken. In cities where we do door-to-door selling, we obtain the appropriate permits. A number of the following comments reflect this procedure.

SUN MYUNG MOON

Sun Myung Moon is the founder and director of the Unification Church International. A lifelong Christian, he has devoted his whole life to pioneering a new dimension in man's relationship with God. His success in this and in leading others to immensely richer lives seems to be a product of several gifts:

- The capacity to sense the need of a changing world for a new, integrating expression of Truth.
- 2. A capacity to see the universal implications of his own special religious experience.
- 3. A remarkable ability to call forth what is highest and best in others.
- 4. A bold imagination combined with excellent organizational and leadership skills.
- 5. The capacity to sustain himself in the step by step process of moving toward a large goal.

These capacities, converged in an unusual man in a special time, have produced an inspiring teaching, a tremendous vision of hope, and a dynamic organization.

Rev. Moon was born in Pyungan Buk-Do province in what is presently North Korea on January 6. 1920. His spiritual depth was evident at an early age, for even as a child his life was centered around prayer and meditation. When he was 16, while in deep prayer on Easter morning, Jesus appeared to him, revealing that Rev. Moon would have a great mission in the fulfillment of God's providence. The next nine years were spent in internal preparation through intense prayer and study. During this time he sought the hidden meaning of the parables and symbols in the Bible and the origin of human suffering. Later, he studied engineering at Waseda University in Japan, still continuing his deep spiritual life. With the liberation of Korea from Japanese occupation, forty years

Moon began his public ministry, actively teaching and leading others to an understanding of God's new dispensation. However, as Communism arose in North Korea, its repression of religion, especially Christianity, surpassed even that of the Japanese. Rev. Moon had gathered a considerable following; but due to his initial success, he was considered a threat, arrested by the Communists, beaten, and left for dead. Fortunately, his followers found and cared for him.

Rev. Moon recovered, but was again arrested, and this time sent to Hungnam prison camp. He was sent there to die. In this camp, although the average prisoner's life span was only six months, he survived for nearly three years. He obtained release from the prison camp in 1950 during the Allied northern offensive in the Korean War.



Rev. Moon officially began the Holy Spirit Association for the Unification of World Christianity (also known as the Unification Church) in Seoul, South Korea, in 1954. The Divine Principle is the essential teaching of the Church. It is the product of the research and revelations received over the years by Rev. Moon, and its impact is just beginning to be felt throughout the world. The first written presentation of the Divine Principle was published in 1957. The following year missionaries were sent to Japan and the United States, and the Unification Church began its international work.

UNIFICATION CHURCH

The Unification Church was founded in 1954 in Seoul, South Korea, by Rev. Moon. It is now established in over 40 countries throughout the world. In 1959 the first missionary arrived in the United States. This was Miss Young Oon Kim, Professor of New Testament and Comparative Religion at Ewha Women's University in Seoul.


In the United States, the majority of the Church membership are young people in their twenties. Due to the practicality and logic of the *Divine Principle*, these young people have found a substantial program for building a better world. Members have found that problems within society—such as drug abuse, sexual license, corruption, discrimination, breakdown of marriage and the family unit, as


well as lack of communication between individuals, generations, groups, and so on—have been overcome through the application of the *Divine Principle*. Most importantly, the Church's understanding of God and man satisfies the great spiritual hunger in young Americans.


Many questions in traditional Christianity—especially those concerning the nature of God, Christ and salvation—can be more deeply understood through the *Divine Principle*. The Church conveys a great awareness of how God is working with the world today, and the significant role America has at this time.

Many ministers, in both the East and the West, find this doctrine a source of inspiration both for themselves personally and for their congregations. In Korea

recently, 900 Christian ministers received special group training in the "Principle."

Also in Korea, mass weddings of 3, 36, 72, 124, 430, and 777 couples have taken place. The wedding of 777 couples embraced couples from 10 nations, including 7 from America. By performing these marriages, Rev. Moon demonstrates the basic tenet of the *Divine Principle*: Love within the family unit is the key to world peace.

The Unification Church in Korea now has nearly three quarters of a million members, and continues to grow very rapidly. Church centers have been opened in all fifty states in America.

Application of the Principle is well expressed in the Unification Church motto:

To restore the world, let us go forth with the Father's heart in the shoes of a servant, shedding tears for man, sweat for earth, and blood for heaven.


FREEDOM LEADERSHIP FOUNDATION

The Freedom Leadership Foundation (FLF) is a nationwide, non-profit educational organization established in 1969 by a group of young men and women who were deeply concerned about the influence of Marxist thought in America and the consequent erosion of national purpose and will. It is the American affiliate of the International Federation for Victory over Communism, which was founded by Sun Myung Moon in 1967; IFVC is currently active in 34 Free World countries.

Motivated by religious ideals, the Freedom Leadership Foundation has adopted the following goals:

- To respond to the challenge of world crisis by promoting the high quality of leadership necessary to preserve and extend freedom to all peoples:
- To educate and inform all men of the responsibilities of that freedom, as man's highest gift from God;
- 3. To proclaim that the materialistic, anti-democratic doctrines of Marxism-Leninism constitute at present the greatest single barrier to the fulfillment of world freedom:
- 4. To inspire and develop dedicated leaders who are committed to the revitalization of this society, protecting its heritage and ideals while pioneering new levels of achievement.



FLF members have been at the forefront of campus movements throughout the nation confronting the negativity and distortion of the radical left. Rallies, demonstrations, petition campaigns, prayer vigils, "fasts for freedom," joint conferences with other groups, debates, discussions, lectures, films and press conferences are among those activities which FLF members have organized on campuses from coast to coast—in addition to carrying out the day-to-day activities of literature production, distribution, and campus "table sitting."

The Freedom Leadership Foundation publishes a biweekly newspaper, The Rising Tide. The Tide offers a nationwide vouth-oriented alternative to the radical underground press by presenting a responsible view of international events along with critiques of Marxist theory and news about FLF activities. The Tide was recently the recipient of the Freedom Award of the Hungarian Freedom Fighters and the Honor Certificate Award of The Freedoms Foundation at Valley Forge.

World Freedom Institute—Through World Freedom Institute seminars, students and other youth leaders are trained in techniques to overcome Communism ideologically. FLF is expanding the Institute's proven capability to reach the greatest number of students by establishing a training center in Washington as a base for coordinated international activities and communications. Among these programs are the hosting of foreign youth delegations to the United States and special training for foreign students studying in this country.

ONE WORLD CRUSADE

One World Crusade is an international organization of people who believe in the ideal world of brotherhood and are dedicated to achieving world unity under God. The Crusade was organized in 1972 by Sun Myung Moon in the United States and has branches in Europe and Asia.

The purpose of the One World Crusade is to provide the conditions for society's emergence into a world-unified civilization. Through the use of the Divine Principle ideology, the One World Crusade, will develop an interrelationship among the disciplines of science, religion, culture, economics and politics.

There are presently mobile units of the One World Crusade travelling in each of the continental United States. There are also 10 international teams of 70 members each who travel in five state regions. The teams are made up of European, Asian and American members who give lectures and rallies and appear on local and national media. Their desire is to reawaken America to the spirit by which it was founded —a belief in God, freedom, justice, and dignity for man.

Some of Rev. Moon's future plans for the One World Crusade include forming an international unit by the end of 1974 which will coordinate Crusade activities in 120 nations. Ultimately, the program will encompass 8,000 members involved in America alone—2,000 of whom will be mobilized. The Crusade currently works in conjunction with both the Unification Church and World Freedom Institute to hold unification ideology seminars at centers throughout the nation.

INTERNATIONAL CULTURAL FOUNDATION

Founded by Rev. Moon in 1968 in Japan, the International Cultural Foundation seeks to facilitate the global convergence of international cultures by promoting cultural exchanges among nations and by promoting academic studies which hold promise of making vital contributions to world goodwill and peace.

The most well known program of the International Cultural Foundation is the annual International Conference on the Unity of the Sciences. Initiated by Rev. Moon, the first conference was held in New York City in November of 1972 and the second a year later in Tokyo. The third will be held in the fall of 1974 in London. The purpose of the conference is to develop understandings which will bring about an integration of scientific knowledge and positive moral values. Indeed, the conference theme in each case has been the "Moral Orientation of the Sciences." Scientists from Britain, France, Germany, Sweden, Italy, the Republic of China, Korea, and America have participated.

Also, the Foundation each summer sponsors the "International Leadership Seminar," inviting students from foreign countries to the United States for training in international leadership. At the 1974 seminar, over 200 students from Korea, Japan, France, and Germany attended the 40 day seminar. It was held at the training center in Barrytown, N.Y., and included educational trips to New York, Washington, D.C., Boston, and other cities.

SUN MYUNG MOON CHRISTIAN CRUSADE

The Sun Myung Moon Christian Crusade was founded for the purpose of reviving the Christian spirit of joy and hope in a world of despair and spiritual darkness. It is a nonsectarian movement intended to make God a living reality for all—and especially for our youth who have been turning away from traditional religious expressions.

The Crusade presents the exciting "Celebration of Life" in cities across the country. Each "Celebration" has two aspects: joyous entertainment by a variety of performers, and an inspirational message by

The major purpose of the Society for a Moral World is the promotion of Christian principles as they apply to patterns of living and the achievement of individual happiness. It is the position of the Society that high moral standards and individual fulfillment go inextricably hand in hand. To advance this understanding and to apply Christian principles to specific moral situations is the work of the Society.

Founded in 1973 by Rev. Moon, the first project of the Society is an innovative drug education program. Many of our Nation's youth have "dropped out" of conventional society and have naively slipped into the drug culture, seeing it as a better alternative. The purposes of the Society's drug education program are firstly to inform America's youth of newly confirmed medical findings regarding the physical and psychological damage inherent in extensive drug use and secondly, to lead such youth to positive alternative life styles based on Christian principles. 49







I have been meaning to write to you to tell you what a wonderful group of young people you have, here in Berkeley, in The Unification Church - and how grateful I am for them, and the influence they are exerting.

I have never met such a fine group of sincere, reverent, clean, patriotic and deeply religious young people - at least in many recent years. To be sure, there are some older people - for there are no restrictions on your group - but, on the whole, they are young people.

l am deeply impressed with them. They have been so kind and friendly - even to coming, on accasion to our church, on special occasions (such as our service this week, on Humiliation, Penitence Fasting and Prayer - called for by the Senate).

I am Professor of the History of Religions and Director of Libraries at the Graduate Theological Union, a consortium of four Protestant and three Roman Catholic seminaries in Berkeley, California. I have been asked to write a few words concerning the Unification Church of the Reverend Myung Sun Moon of Korea. As a specialist in the religions which many youth are joining today, I have not only been studying the literature of the movement, but have been particularly interested in the social role that this church is playing in our society during a period of cultural change. A similar study was made of the Hare Krishna Movement, which is currently being published by John Wiley as a text book on religion in America, entitled Hare Krishna and the Counterculture.

The philosophy of the Reverend Moon is based on Christian principles. The Unification Church emphasizes the love of God and man as one unified family. Its goals are the Christian ideals of peace, brotherhood, and love for all mankind with no discrimination as to race creed or color.

As I have associated with its members here in Berkeley, I am particularly impressed by the genuine expression of the highest Christian morals, lack of racial discrimination and the warm friend-liness which is extended to everyone, even though he be a stranger.

If it is zealous in converting others to its way of belief, unlike the Jesus People and some other groups, it is tolerant toward the religious positions of others, and extends its love to all.

If one notes that many of the youth in the organization have formerly belonged to the drug laden counterculture, which we see expressing itself so violently even today, e.g., the Symbionese Army, he will realize the important transformation which the Unification Church has made in the lives of its members. This movement is reaching many youth whose needs our present institutional Protestant and Roman Catholic Churches are failing to fill, and is playing a very important role in our pluralistic society which should be encouraged and aided in every possible way.

I understand that some of the foreign members of the Unification Church require letters of reference for visiting the United States.

My only contact with the church was that on two recent occasions in pursuit of my newspaper work I attended meetings of the Unification Church at which the Rev. Mr. Moon spoke. His addresses on both occasions had to do with morality and the leading of a decent life.

I was able to speak at some length to eight or nine members of the church, mostly young people and was impressed by their dedication to a concept calling for decency and morality in their own behavior and in spreading this concept to others. These young people take the moral teachings of Jesus Christ seriously and believe that happiness comes from following those teachings. They try to show other young people that there is an alternative to drugs, revolution and free sex, which they don't believe brings any peace of mind. They appear to be effective in bringing into their movement many young people who previously were self-indulgent. They are very strong on teaching that a decent, religious family is the backbone of a nation's moral and economic prosperity. They do not appear to me to be clannish but rather, are very open about their views and welcome all persons to their meetings.

To me they appear to be a religious group which advocates the restoration of morality, both public and private, in men's affairs.
