DAY OF HOPE TO OPEN AT CARNEGIE HALL

New York has been successful in reserving the famous Carnegie Hall for the opening of the Day of Hope lecture tour. Our Leader announced his desire to have 1000 members present for the opening, including European, Japanese and U.S. national leaders and couples.

A number of the MU Commanders and State Representatives from western states came to Denver to meet with Our <u>Leader</u>. PRES. KIMOn Wednesday, May 31st, President Kim departed Kennedy Inter-
national Airport for Korea, his first visit there in six
months. It is rumored that he had planned to leave quietly
on May 30th but that Our Leader initiated a special day of
