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Our Master's Answers to the Questions

"Do Science and religion conflict in regard to the time lapse of the creation and the historical records?

"There is conflict between historians and anthropologists or archeologists. I do not necessarily think that Adam lived 6,000 years ago. The time between Adam and Abraham is considered as the prehistoric age. At that time, according to the Bible, people lived 800 or 900 years. We don't know if they had the same kind of calendar we have today. Nine hundred years in their time might not be 900 years by our way of measuring time.

"As it says in the Bible, one day is like a thousand years and a thousand years as one day. Often things revealed by God are not literally true, but symbolical. The ten generations are not necessarily literal. God may choose one person out of 10 million to accompish a certain mission. He will count that person as one generation. Adam was the first generation; Jesus was the second generation; and the Lord of the Second Coming is the third generation.

"There have been two forerunners before me in Korea. They were both elders in the Christian Church. Both did great work, but neither followed me. Spiritually gifted people sometimes received that Elder Nawa the first generation and Elder Pak was the second generation and the Lord of the Second Coming is the third generation. They are not related at all.

"Not all people who lived between the times of Adam and Noah are considered, but those selected people. Noah's account should be taken literally. God's providence or dispensation with Noah was carried on by that individual. Therefore, the events in his life time must be taken literally. Only the time element is not to be taken literally. The existence of Noah and of Adam as individual human beings is factual." "What were Adam and Eve created from - animal like humans?

"Have you ever wondered how a plant came into being? Where did the seed come from? In the small seed is every potential of the big tree. Likewise, in God's energy and power itself is all the potential of man.

"A baby is born through the strong love of its father and mother. God's strong love, His energy, created the baby Adam. Eve was not created out of Adam's rib, but was created after Adam and after Adam's pattern."

Dr. Timothy Leary, a former lecturer on clinical psychology at Harvard University, now one of the high priests of the psychodelic movement said at a recent interview, "There's no question that LSD is a sacrament. It helps us find God."

Dr. Leary said that a movie on LSD and "trips" would soon be released commercially. This new cult is being communicated to thousands of people at very large meetings such as the "psychedelic celebration" held recently in San Francisco. This celebration drew between 1,000 and 1200 people, mostly young people. They paid up to \$4.50 for their seats.

At this meeting Dr. Leary urged his audience to "turn on, tune in, drop out", he said "You've got to detach yourself from everything that's meaningless in life." He urged the audience to not wait for a college dogree or to pay off the mortgage. He attacked societies current social structures by saying "The menopause of mentality has lost touch with the power inside. The problem is

Charles Steinmetz, the electrical wizard, used to work in his laboratory at General Electric late at night. He was asked why he did this. He didn't get anymore salary because of his long hours. Steinmetz said, "My friend, it doesn't matter how much you get or who pays you. You are always working for yourself."

4. Tackle little jobs as if they were big ones.

Some people don't realize that the big job consists of many little jobs, all of which have to be done well. If even small jobs are consistently well done sooner or later the secret will be out, and many people will hear of it.

5. Create your own style.

Style is considered the truest form of selfexpression. "A man's style," said 17th-century author Francois Fenelon, "is as much a part of him as his face, his figure or the rhythm of his pulse." Doing something you can call your own satisfies a deep need within yourself. All of us feel the urge to impose our own order on some small part of this chaotic world. It is the way we discover who we are. It is the way we create rainbows.
