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Did They "See" Tomorrow? By T. F. James

Would you believe an unlettered photographer who predicted, in a trance, that sometime between 1958 and 1998 New York City will crumble into the sea? Would you believe the collapse of Soviet Russia and a war between planets, predicted by a medieval astrologer who has been dead 400 years?

Or a Washington housewife who predicts that Russia will some day "dictate" terms for world peace?

Probably not. But a glance at the record of these strange futurists is bound to be disquieting. Working strictly from inner vision, they have hit bulls'-eyes surprisingly often on the events they anticipated.

If we except the Hebrew prophets of the Bible, the granddaddy of this breed is Michael Nostradamus, a medieval astrologer who served the kings of France in the mid-Sixteenth Century. ...Full of...tricky plays on words--and chronologically scrambled...-Nostradamus's prophesies have been a scholarly battle-ground for 400 years...But few people deny that he predicted, some 200 years in advance, the French Revolution and the rise of Napoleon.

As for America, he foresaw our Revolution 100 years before the first landing at Plymouth Rock: "The Occident, free from British Isles, Not satisfied, sad rebellion."

He predicted World War II, or something like it....

Remember--this man was writing before 1566. What does he have to say for our time? ...he saw a day when England and the United States would become one nation, governed from Washington, D.C....

••••• a terrible world war which Nostradamus sees emanating from the east in 1999: "The Oriental shall come forth from his seat...to see France...And shall strike everyone with his rod."

After this war...Nostradamus sees a golden age beginning around the year 2000 and lasting a long time.... ...Edgar Cayce, a man of our own century, born...in 1877, and with no more than a grammar school education. Cayce, who died in 1945, discouvered his psychic gifts in 1901 when he was 24. Under self-hypnosis, he found he could diagnose illnesses and prescribe the proper treatment for people hundreds of miles away whom he's never met. Under this same hypnosis, he frequently "read" the past and future....

On the short-run predictions, particularly in connection with world affairs, Cayce was not very accurate....When it came to natural phenomena, Cayce seemed far better "plugged in." ...

In somewhat murky prose Cayce predicted startling futures for Russia and China:

"Through Russia comes the hope of the world. Not in respect to what is sometimes termed Communism or Bolshevism--no; But freedom--freedom!...It will take years for it to be crystallized; yet out of Russia comes again the hope of the world. By what will it be guided? By friendship with that nation which hath even placed on its monetary unit In God We Trust...

"In China one day will be the cradle of Christianity as applied in the lives of men. Far off, as man counts time; but only a day in the heart of God..."

Mystics peer into the future in different ways. Cayce used self-hypnosis. Nostradamus was a profound student of astrology. Jeane Dixon, on the other hand, uses a crystal ball. This devoutly religious (Roman Catholic) Washington housewife, whose biography, "A Gift of Prophecy," was a best-seller in '65 and '66, has a string of successful predictions including the death of F.D.R., the subsequent collapse of our wartime alliance with Russia, the assassination of John F. Kennedy, the airplane death of Dag Hammarskjold and Marilyn Monroe's suicide.

Jeane Dixon's sight coincides remarkably with some predictions of Nostradamus and Edgar Cayce. She sees a vast war erupting in the 1980s in which numerous African and Asian nations will turn against us and join Red China in a worldwide racial struggle in which Russia and America will be allies. The war will last until 1999 when a ravaged, desolated globe will be shocked into spiritual renewal. A new Christianity, which will unite every sect and creed, will come under the leadership of a man she "saw" born on Bebruary 5th, 1962, somewhere in the Middle East....

As for America, Mrs. Dixon foresees worsening racial troubles--particularly in 1968....She feels Pr.sident Johnson is "vulnerable" to great personal danger and has flatly declared the U.S. will have three Presidents between 1961 and 1969....

Nostradamus, Cayce, Dixon--it is easy to laugh at their strange prophecies, but it might be equally rash to ignore them. (Source: This Week Magazine, January 14, 1968)
