

Who we are

The Unification Church was founded in 1954 in Korea by Sun Myung Moon. Over a long course of prayer and study, Rev. Moon discovered a series of principles which yielded great insight into the deep questions of human life and faith: the nature of God, the origin of suffering, the purpose of creation and life. As a Christian, he explored many of the puzzling problems of Bible interpretation and found a pattern in the Bible according to which God has been conducting His providence through history and even in the present-day world. In the light of these principles, the deeper meanings of the Bible could be clearly seen, as well as the purpose of all religions.

Because he tried to share his enriched understanding with other Christians, Rev. Moon was imprisoned several times in Communist North Korea and severely tortured. Finally he endured nearly Through Jesus' sacrifice of his own life for others he not only set the pattern for all Christians, but he opened the gate of spiritual salvation through which we can walk by loving and having faith in him.

Full salvation brings us to the standard of the original man of God's creation, who can be one with Him, reflect His nature fully, and in whom God can dwell. Christ comes not only to save individuals in this way, but to restore families, the world, and the order of the universe to reflect God's original intention. Jesus wanted to restore the world of sorrow and suffering to the ideal world of joy and harmony (Isaiah 9, 11). He brought us spiritual salvation on the individual level, but Christ promised to return. The Second Coming will bring physical salvation, the fulfillment of the promises of the ideal world, the ideal family, and the ultimate relationship with God. "... He will dwell with them, and they shall be his people, and God himself will be with them; he will wipe away every tear from their eyes . . . neither shall there be mourning nor crying nor pain any more " (Rev. 21:3b-4)

Christians are thus responsible for not only their own personal salvation, but to bring their families and the whole world in accordance with God's will.

What about life after death? Just as our bodies express our invisible minds—thoughts, feelings, personality, character—the physical universe expresses an invisible, spiritual world. Our bodies live in and interact with the things of the physical world through our physical senses, and our minds or spirits dwell in the world of thought and feeling and interact with it through our spiritual senses. Because of the human fall, the spirit and body became separated from each other, causing the inner struggle we all experience (Rom. 7:21-25). Also, our spiritual senses became dulled, and we became unable to perceive the reality of the spiritual universe and God.

Nevertheless, such a spiritual world exists as an objective reality, just as God does. In the course of salvation our spiritual sensitivity is gradually restored—both to us as individuals and to mankind as a whole during the development of salvation history. For that reason, as history approaches its endpoint, more and more people have spiritual and psychic experiences, and God could promise that He would pour out His spirit on everyone. (Acts 2:17-18)

Our spirits live forever, just as energy cannot be destroyed. After separation from our physical bodies at death, our spirits live on in the spiritual world—with exactly the same personality, desires, dislikes, and aspirations as before death. We create our spirits by the quality of our life on earth; by the degree of goodness we "build into" them through our actions. Therefore, learning to love God, our parents, brothers and sisters, spouses, children and all mankind is the most important preparation for our eternal life.

Heaven is the realm in the spiritual world where perfected people dwell in oneness with God, as one family of the heavenly Father. But heaven must be experienced on earth before we can dwell in it eternally. Therefore Jesus came to bring the kingdom of heaven on earth, and he left its key with Christians on earth. (Matt. 16:19) Hell is separation from God, whether on earth or in the spirit world. God did not create hell, but it came about through man's fall. Hell will gradually pass away as heaven expands.

How has God been intervening in human history? At the beginning of history, the ideal world was lost when people were overwhelmed by evil motivations. God is above all a loving Parent, and He has been seeking every individual lost to Him. He has been calling each person to overcome his fallen nature and return to Him in goodness.

In the work of restoration, or God's providence of salvation. God worked first to find one individual who could overcome his evil nature, and on the foundation of that person's faith to find a family around him, a society, a nation, and finally to restore the whole world. At various levels those whom He has chosen to work with have failed Him. History has gone in cycles or patterns because God had to choose other individuals, families and nations to fulfill the incomplete missions of their predecessors. Until success is attained at each level, human beings remain in the grip of evil-which produces suffering and chaos in individual life and in the world as a whole.

The Bible contains the history of God's work with His chosen nation of Israel. In it we can find the patterns of the way in which He is still working with individuals and nations today.



What we believe

"If you have God's love reflected in you, you want to reach out to every corner of the world, because God's mind is like that."



"If you can love one person, God's love will be there in proportion to the depth and size of that love. If you can love many people like this, God's love will come in proportion to the greatness of that love, to the depth of that love."



"God is the Center of man's love, life, and happiness, and man is the being without which God's purpose cannot be fulfilled."

What is God? Although we cannot directly perceive God with our physical senses because He is an infinite Being, we can know Him by studying the universe He created, as Paul pointed out (Rom. 1:19-20). Whatever a creator produces reflects his nature. The patterns we find elaborated in the universe tell us about their Cause. God.

Everything exists in pairs-masculine and feminine, positive and negative, receptive and initiating. Therefore God must Himself contain the ultimate masculine and feminine qualities within His nature-I the essence of manhood and womanhood (Gen. 1:27)—as well as, for example, the simple positivity and negativity that we find in electrical charges. Also, all things have an internal nature (usually invisible, such as our mind) which is expressed through an external form (usually visible, such as our body, its expressions and motions). Likewise, God has an internal Nature, which is ultimately His heart of infinite personal love, and an external Form, which is ultimately the energy of the universe.

God may be Infinite Mind, the Ground of Being, the Tao—an abstract energizing Force as represented, for example, by Eastern philosophy, but He is above all the loving Parent, the Origin and Essence of love, as Christianity teaches.

Why did God create man and the universe? No one can be happy if there is nothing in his life to stimulate him. Above all, we need other people with whom we find rapport, with whom we can cooperate, and whom we can love and be loved by. For that reason everyone seeks a mate. We love our children especially because we find in their physical features and personalities the resemblance of ourselves as parents. God created human beings as sons and daughters who could reflect Him fully and when matured could unite with Him in complete harmony and love. God wanted to dwell within and among human beings as His own family. Thus, God created man in order to have jov.

A parent rejoices when his children are happy. God produced the universe to bring joy to man. All things resemble man and have the potential to respond to his love and care. Man should see himself in the beauty and wonder of the creation, and all things should bring him joy and comfort when he loves and cares for them properly.

What was God's ideal in creating?

Every man and woman has the capacity to reflect fully the image of God and to become entirely one with Him when he has matured spiritually. We achieve this unity with God when we come to develop fully our capacity for love and can thus communicate with Him heart to heart. In family life we ideally find the most complete expression of the range and depth of human love—love of parents for children, love of husband and wife, and love of children for their parents. God's love is the infinite counterpart of the three basic modes of human love. Thus it is in the perfected family that God can find the full reflection of His heart, and in that family God can dwell.

Through the give and take of love among family members horizontally and between the family and God vertically, the utmost joy is experienced by all and projected into their surrounding world.

What is salvation? Through the fall of man, our ability to love became impaired. We are limited in our possibility of attaining the ideal human nature and creating perfect families. Thus also we are separated from God: we cannot understand and respond to Him because of the limitations of our own hearts, and we cannot unite with other human beings as we should to create the world in which He can dwell. Because of the fall, too, we lost our capacity to perceive things spiritual; and the necessity for faith in things unseen (Heb. 11:1) came about. Further, we became alienated from the creation and came to abuse nature and exploit our environment. God, man, and the universe were plunged into suffering: "We know that the whole creation has been groaning in travail together until now; and not only the creation, but we ourselves . . . groan inwardly as we wait for adoption as sons . . . " (Rom. 8:22-23)

Christ comes as the mediator between fallen man and God; by uniting in heart and action with Christ who is one with the heavenly Father, we are "saved" and can come into a relationship with God as His children. Jesus said that he was the true vine and we are the branches (John 15:5) when we abide in him. This is so because Christ teaches us not only the nature of the Father who loves us, but also the life of self-sacrifice by which we can purify ourselves and develop our true human nature. Thus Jesus Christ said: "Whoever seeks to gain his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life will preserve it" (Luke 17:33).



three years in a prison camp before United Nations forces released him along with other prisoners, and he was free to return to the south. At that time he organized The Holy Spirit Association for the Unification of World Christianity (The Unification Chruch) based on the principles revealed to him during his years of search.

The Unification Church does not aim to be another denomination. On the contrary, it seeks to deepen faith and commitment among all Christians. In this way, the barriers produced by varying Bible interpretations can be overcome. Christian unity can be brought about when all act as one body giving wholehearted devotion and energy toward fulfilling God's will—loving Him and serving others.

It is the idea of The Unification Church to end God's grief and man's suffering by giving ourselves completely in love and service. In bringing not only ourselves, but our families, churches, nations and the whole world to live in this way, we can indeed bring God's Kingdom on earth as Jesus taught us to pray.

From its small beginning in Seoul in 1954, The Unification Church has grown to include active movements in more than 40 nations, and in every state and over 120 cities in the United States alone. Members come from a great variety of backgrounds and experiences, and are of all ages and walks of life.

A number of activities, programs, and organizations which the Church supports have sprung up under the inspiration of members. In America these include four well-known examples; One World Crusade, whose headquarters are at the International Training Center in Tarrytown, New York; The Freedom Leadership Foundation, Inc., The D.C. Striders Track Club, and The Day of Hope Festival, all with headquarters in Washington, D.C.

One World Crusade is an

international movement whose aim is to help produce a climate in which a true world brotherhood can come about. Mobile units composed of Europeans and Asians as well as Americans travel in all 50 states appearing on local and national media, holding rallies and giving lectures to reawaken the spirit of public service, self-sacrifice, and belief in God, human dignity, and the value of freedom. In order to combat the increasing influence of materialistic ideologies and the general moral decline in the West, the young people of the One World Crusade are working together with a dedication which transcends cultural and traditional barriers and makes a striking reality of the hope for international brotherhood.



The Day of Hope Festival

culminated its three year U.S. tour when Rev. Moon spoke in September of 1974 to an SRO crowd of over 25,000 at New York's Madison Square Garden, Thirty-five thousand were turned away outside. Rev. Moon spoke on the purpose of the 2nd Coming—to establish the Kingdom of God on Earth. In January of 1975 the Festival began a seven nation tour of both Asia and Europe, promoting positive spiritual values and international unity. Almost 400 young men and women are travelling with the Festival. Through this kind of experience, the Church wants to develop leaders with a truly international vision for this international age. In July of 1975, another 400 member team will begin a similar tour.



The Freedom Leadership Foundation, Inc., was formed in 1969 in Washington by several members of the Unification Church who were deeply concerned about the influence of Marxist thought in America, particularly on college campuses, and the coincident erosion of national purpose and will. In an effort to counteract these trends. programs were initiated which later matured into the World Freedom Institute. through which students and youth leaders were introduced to critiques of Marxism and a counterproposal based on the Unification Principle. In addition, FLF publishes weekly The Rising Tide. originally a youth-oriented alternative to the proliferating underground and radical press. The Rising Tide has been gaining national attention because of its responsible and balanced approach to international news as well as its effective theoretical analyses. The Tide was recently the recipient of The Freedom Award of the Hungarian Freedom Fighters and the Honor Certificate Award of The Freedoms Foundation at Valley Forge.



The D.C. Striders Track Club was organized by a local Church member in Washington, D.C. Originally composed entirely of inner city youth, the Striders provided a rare opportunity for personal development and rapidly drew public attention to the skill and talent of these young men. The great success of the D.C. Striders in national competition has made it possible for over 200 young men to receive substantial college scholarships.
