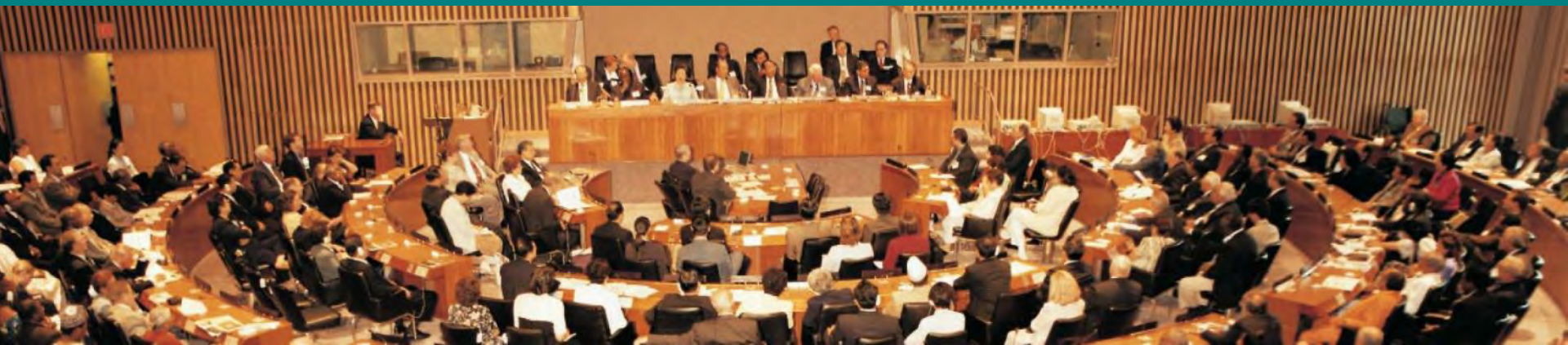

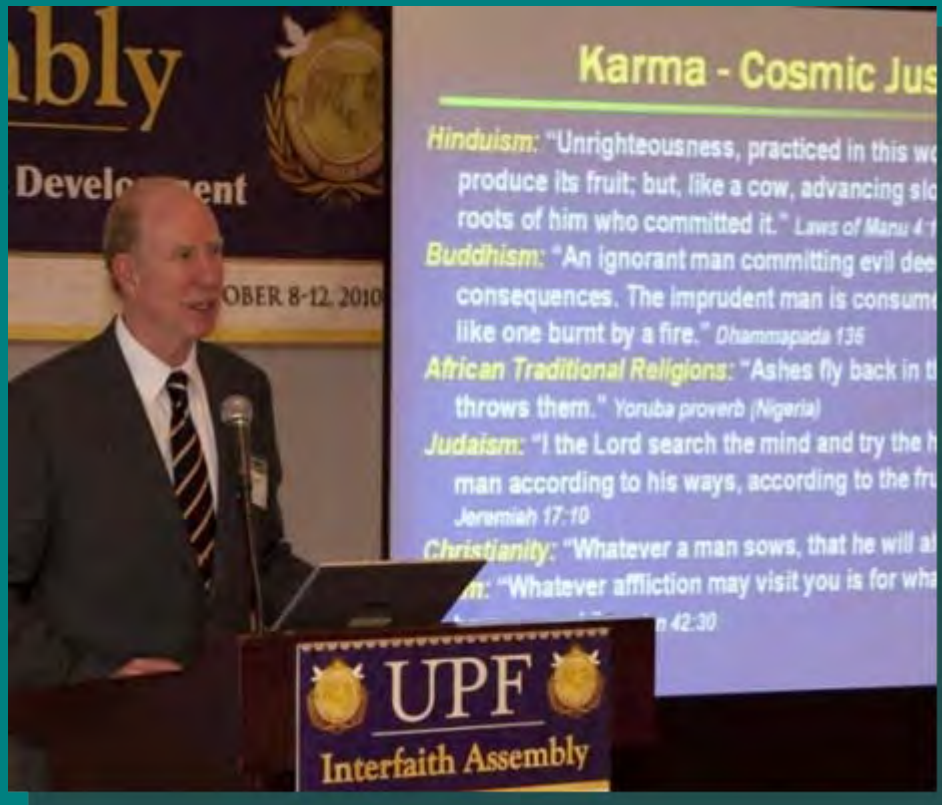

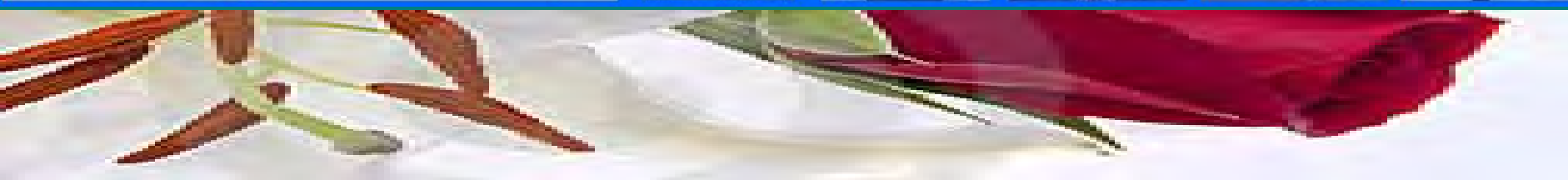

2. Preview of main events & goals for 2011

2 i) UPF International Plans for Organizational Growth

1. Ambassadors for Peace

- Expand each nation's AfP network to minimum of 3 X number of parliamentarians in the nation
- Update database of AFPs & UPF contacts.

2. Registered Chapters - Expand UPF Chapter Registration to 170 nations and get activity reports from at least 120 of these.

3. Regional Peace Councils

- Develop Global Peace Council as global parliament that convenes annually and addresses global issues.
- Develop 12 Regional Peace Councils.

1. All 36 nations to have UPF Secretary-General & UPF activities
2. All communities to have UPF activities and UPF responsible person
3. UPF in all nations & communities to contribute to European and international level

2 iii) The importance and value of ILCs and ELCs

1. Main development through God's word ("education, education, education")
2. Inspired Afps will act wisely, well & often
3. ILCs are main way that key AfPs can develop a relationship to TPs
4. Nations & Communities that send participants to ILCs develop well

ILC's & ELCs in 2011

1. **ILCs** Only known ILC is at time of Wongu Peace Cup in mid October. We have 7 months to invite highest level people.
2. **ELCs** Some key parts of the programme are in place. Others to be finalised in Prague

- **President Song guiding us to plan one European UPF event each month in 2011**
- **These should develop a strong European Peace Council**
- **Events should be held in major European cities using Parliaments, UN facilities and public institutions for the Conferences.**
- Suggested locations include:
 - London – Houses of Parliament
 - Paris – UNESCO
 - Berlin – Bundestag
 - Geneva – UN
 - Vienna – UN
 - Brussels – EU or National Parliament
 - Budapest – National Parliament
 - Oslo – National Parliament
 - Japan – human rights issues
 - Korea – Blessing preparation
 - Dublin Emmaus Centre and Dail
 - Malta – Parliament

ELC programme in 2011

Main Themes suggested for 2011

1. Peace-building and conflict resolution strategies and good practice – forgiveness & reconciliation (interfaith emphasis but also other approaches)

2. Family Policy – (preparation/support etc)

Possible format for ELC programme 2011

10 Conferences – January, March, April, May, June, August, September, October, November, December

- Secure high level speakers from among existing AfPs and new contacts.
- Goal 120 participants each month (1200 for 2011 as a whole)
- Each Community and nation to fulfill 1/1/1 (send one participant per month)
- Papers presented in the themed conferences to be published and distributed

2. v) The importance of Peace Councils

True Father has said that when we bring 120 AfPs from each of 10 categories (*religion/interfaith, politics, academe, business, NGOs, professions, women, The Arts, military, media*) together to form a National Peace Council we can truly change the nation's destiny
