

41 Tongil Group leaders in New York to learn about the of their organizations

Forty-one leaders of the Tongil Group of Korea arrived in New York on September 19 to learn about the heart and legacy of the founders of their organizations, True Parents. Although these leaders are employees and executives of companies under FFWPU Korea, including Segye Times, Yong Pyeong Resort, and Il Hwa, many of them do not identify as Unificationists. Following Dr. Kim's presentation, everybody enjoyed lunch together. The kitchen staff at the Hyo Jeong East Garden Museum prepared delicious Korean food for the group, in order to offer them a comforting taste of their homeland despite being abroad.



On September 21, they toured the New Yorker Hotel and the Manhattan Center, and they went to Washington, D.C., where they visited the Washington Times and learned more about True Parents' vision for America and world peace. With a new perspective on the history of their organizations, the Tongil Group leaders headed back to Korea.
