The couple exchanged affectionate strokes of conversation in what any viewer would see as a warm portrait of their relationship. "This was going to be my honey, this was going to be honey, this was going to be my knight in shining armor, but that wasn't my first thought, which was, Oh - I'm math and science, he's artistic," said Cathy Williams recalling her matching experience.
