- B. The ancestor blessing ceremony will be held once a month. Ancestors from generations 1-210 can receive the ancestor blessing if at least 100 days have passed from the day they were liberated, and if the liberation donation has been fully offered. An ancestor blessing ceremony will be held on the third weekend of each month. In February, May, August and October, the Ancestor Blessing Ceremony will be held during the Special Great Works workshop.
- C. Ancestors who have become Absolute Good Spirits will go to their descendant's home 40 days after the Ancestor Blessing Ceremony. It is appropriate to conduct a simple "Welcome Home" service.
