Albanian UPF, FFWPU Hold DP Seminar for 55 AfPs
















Fifty-five Ambassadors for Peace from Albania, North Macedonia, and Montenegro attended a three-day Divine Principle seminar organized by the Albanian chapters of UPF and FFWPU at the Palas Lux Hotel in Montenegro's coastal town of Petrovac. Former Albanian President Alfred Moisiu offered the congratulatory remarks. Among the participants were members of the UPF Board and leaders of 16 Peace Councils in Albania, representatives of expatriate Albanians' Peace Councils in North Macedonia and Montenegro, the deputy rector of Durres University, a former prefect and member of parliament from Durres city, a professor from North Macedonia, the chairman of the Bektashi Order in North Macedonia, and a former member of parliament and government minister from Montenegro. Dr. Eva Çipi, the chair of UPF-Albania, gave the welcoming remarks. Jacques Marion, the UPF co-chair for Europe and the Middle East, and Gani Rroshi, the UPF leader for the Balkans, presented the lectures. – *Gani Rroshi*

Elena Kalmatskaya (Eastern Europe Second Gen Department leader) spoke about parents' authority and defining limits; Oleg Kuzmin (BFD-Russia leader) spoke about the male and female qualities of matrimony; Olga Galiullina (Central Russia Second Gen Department leader) spoke about the characteristics of 7- to 12-year-old children. There were many interactive sessions in pairs and groups, Q&A sessions, informal communications over lunch, and "talk shows" with the Kuzmin, Sokurov and Salmanov blessed families. The 25 participants of the conference "Modernity: Person and Culture" were students of the Russian Christian Humanitarian Academy; leaders of the Russian Orthodox Church, the Bahá'í Faith and other religious organizations; philosophers, and religious scholars. 
Eastern Europe BFD Activities













The BFD of Eastern Europe recently held three seminars to present Part 2 of Level 2 Blessing education as a follow-up to a previous EUME Blessing workshop. A total of 33 Blessing candidates –10 in Albania, 12 in Russia, and 11 in Ukraine – took part. Each nation prepared content most relevant for their candidates. The seminars included sincere testimonies from blessed families about their own preparation for matching.

A webinar about the Spirit World/Physical World Blessing drew an audience of around 30 leaders and members. New assistants who have experience of guiding candidates through the process were introduced. The webinar was recorded in both Russian and English.

Under the guidance of Russian national leader Alexei Saveliev, the Blessed Family and Second Generation Departments of Russia worked together to hold a very successful workshop about different aspects of blessed family life.

In the last few days of 2022, Eastern Europe BFD leader Galina Chernomorets met with regional BFD staff to review the past year and to plan for 2023. – Galina Chernomorets

Youth: Despite the blackouts, the Lviv witnessing centre isn't slowing down – and neither is the youth team in Warsaw. Four guests listened to a one-day DP workshop and one guest attended a two-day DP workshop. ... On the weekend two blessed wives and three Second Generation youths joined street witnessing. ... Young members who will join the "New World Education Team" one-year training program have graduated from a nine-day workshop. ... Eleven Ukrainian matching candidates attended a Blessing workshop. Many members also joined the workshop, both to support the candidates and to renew their own knowledge about the matching and Blessing. The participants listened to elders' guidance and to lectures on the restoration course and the meaning of the Blessing, as well as testimonies of blessed families.

WFWP: Volunteers continue weekly art-therapy workshops for internally displaced and refugee children from Ukraine. Children preparing for Christmas and New Year created pictures with ordinary salt, watching how watercolour paints dissolve on white salt tracks.

In December WFWP purchased more than 50 kg of meat to prepare meals for soldiers who are hospitalized in the central Ukrainian city of Vinnytsia. ... Vinnytsia women prepare pies and other food products for the wounded soldiers, and they donate home-grown vegetables and fruits. One blessed wife who is staying in Vinnytsia also takes part in the project, cooking and bringing meals to the hospital. — Anna Kalmatskaya

They have set a very high standard of faith and unity with True Parents' providence. I particularly want to thank Rev. Jin Pal Chung and his family, who have faithfully supported the providence in Ukraine as National Messiahs.

I am also grateful to the current national leaders of Ukraine, Anna Kalmatskaya and Anatoly Kikin, who have continued their providential work, both inside and beyond the borders of Ukraine, despite the tragic situation.
