


Romantic Romanians Attend Peace Blessing Ball

Russian Couples and Families Attend Two-Day Seminar

• A two-day seminar for couples who have been married 10 to 17 years, with children 12 to 16 years old, was held at the Moscow Peace Embassy. On the first day, 14 couples attended in person, and there were a total of 59 online connections. Three presentations were given: two on marital relations, by Oleg Kuzmin and Aleksandra Skonechna; and one on parent-child relations, by Elena Kalmatskaya. All the presentations were interactive, with a lot of exercises. In the evening there were discussions and even a lesson in dancing the tango, given by Olga Vakulinskaya.

The second day consisted of training for parents and teenagers, which was conducted by Elena Kalmatskaya. A total of 43 participants came to the Peace Embassy, and there was no online component. The parent-child pairs performed interesting tasks to better know and understand each other. Those who didn't participate in the training attended sermons by Oleg Kuzmin and Oksana Salmanova, which were also part of the seminar. At the end, Russian national leader Alexey Savelyev of Russia welcomed all the parents and children. They prayed together and took a group photo.

Interfaith Activists Interviewed Online by UPF-Russia Dr. Alexander Shapiro-Suliman, secretary general of the Alliance of the Peoples of the World, visited the Moscow Peace Embassy to be interviewed by UPF-Moscow Chairman Dmitry Samko. The online interview received about 250 views. Dr. Shapiro-Suliman spoke about the alliance's goals and work. He emphasized the importance of interreligious and interethnic dialogue and of interaction between public organizations. The alliance and UPF-Russia are planning several joint projects in 2023, focusing on the theme of Year of the Teacher and Mentor. – Dmitry Samko

In honour of World Interfaith Harmony Week, Elena Knyazeva, the leader of UPF in the southwestern Russian city of Voronezh, conducted an online interview with Deacon Roman Krinitsyn of the Vysoko-Petrovsky Monastery in Moscow. During the interview, Father Roman told about the church's involvement in urban projects, what "true Orthodox family" means, how he builds relationships in his family with his wife and children, and how he overcomes difficulties in relationships. 
An HTM Workshop and a Matching Ceremony in Armenia
