Dear Rev. Cotter and Jaga,

Attached you will find a report based on data collected from a survey created and sponsored by "a group of 2nd gen concerned that all the varied thoughts and opinions of the youth community are not being heard." Our feeling was that across the US, a great number of young adults have disengaged from the Lovin' Life Ministries (LLM) service. We created this survey to find out if this is true.

So far, 300 people ages 10-40 have participated in the survey. A professional survey website and 'anonymous' identity were used to ensure participants would feel free to express themselves without reprisal. The survey results tabulated in the report confirm there are serious issues that need to be resolved before LLM can become an effective tool to reach this age demographic.

These issues are:

- The bickering between the True Children and use of the pulpit to make personal attacks is a major distraction from the value of the Divine Principle and True Parents teachings.
- Participants unable to attend LLM in New York overwhelmingly dislike the video sermon presentation and would much prefer an intimate local live experience.
- Many participants feel that the sermons have killed their life of faith.
- Many do not feel that LLM is an accurate representation of their faith.

The survey indicates that LLM is a service participants a) don't want to come to and b) would never bring their friends to. The general perception is that the LLM 'branding' is just another coat of paint over a rotting house; because the inner issues are not being resolved, the paint will accomplishing nothing.

The data collected in the survey clearly identifies areas where the LLM service is failing; these obstacles need to be quickly remedied. The 300 participants provided a limited data set; if you sponsor a similar survey using the same methodology that reaches the entire young adult community, you should be able to further refine our observations, and thus better guide your corrective actions.

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1 Executive Summary

1.1.1 Statement of Purpose

The purpose of this survey is to gauge the effectiveness of the Lovin' Life Ministries (LLM) presentation for the 2nd Gen. Diligently collecting, honestly evaluating and utilizing this information is vital to making LLM a success.

The survey is designed to be polite, respectful, and objective. All communications have been conducted in a professional manner. The use of an 'anonymous' identity was used to ensure participants would feel free to express themselves without reprisal.

1.1.2 Methodology

The survey questions are simple and straight forwards. They are not 'leading' the participants to express a positive or negative response. The combination of options, multiple choice, and free-form comments provides a good cross-section of statistical data and personal observations.

The initial invitation to participate in the survey was sent out to fifteen 2nd Gen representatives. It has since been forwarded to others and posted in various places on the Internet.

A professional survey website was used because it provides a secure private mechanism for collecting information, and insures that the survey can only be taken once per computer.

1.1.3 Survey Highlights

Here are some of the key highlights from the participants:

- 300 people participated in the survey; 38% from the west coast, 30% from the north-east, and the remainder scattered around the country (see 2.1.1)
- 52% do not like the LLM service and 54% do not like In Jin Nims sermons (see 2.3.1)
- 65% report that LLM does not feed their life of faith (see 2.3.2)
- 75% do not like the video service (see 2.3.2)
- Only 19% are willing to invite their friends to an LLM video service (see 2.2.3)

All comments can be found in section 2.5. Many participants took the time to write about their likes and dislikes - they all deserve to be read, appreciated, and internalized. These comments have not been altered or sorted in any way.

2.4.1 What do you most enjoy about your local service?

Here are some of the comments (see 2.5.3 for the complete list).

- Fellowship with other BCs
- The involvement of youth to take leadership and initiative to improve the music, various programs, and a wholesome and inviting atmosphere to BCs and non BCs
- It's sloppy, spontaneous, local, fun- it isn't some ultra polished corporate church machine like lovin life. 2.4.2 What do you most dislike about your local service?

Here are some of the typical comments (see 2.5.4 for the complete list).

- Few young people go, though there are many in the area.
- We never have our own local sermons that apply to what our community needs.
- I feel no spirit there. Before IJN at least SOME sermons (few to be fair) brought the spirit of God and helped me connect to God's heart. Now they never do. I especially dislike when she puts in jabs on her brother. I hate that conflict and leave when she brings it up.

2.4.3 How would you help improve the worship service?

Here are some of the comments (see 2.5.5 for the complete list).

- Yes, get rid of live streaming and bring back a live pastor, AKA our local pastor.
- Yes, community participation. Appealing to the youth to have them in charge of worship. I wouldn't show IJN sermons on TV, only for very important occasions. NO reports for sermons.. ever. Reports can take place before or after the actual service.
- I think our community can always use more leaders to step up and organize project connect groups, etc. to help build strong personal relationships in the community, and support spiritual growth throughout the week.
