DESTINY JUNIOR SCHOOL – KIBIRI ON 28/6/2012

During his tour to the IRFF projects in Uganda the Director IRFF Dr Ashley Crosthwaite paid a visit to Destiny Junior School, warmly welcomed by the Head teacher Mrs. Jesca Kyaligamba, who showed him around the school. The bore hole is still under construction; although we had hoped to reach the water table at around 40-50ft actually we hit rock covering the water table at 70ft. Nevertheless, despite setbacks it should be finished mid-July. We saw the conditions in each classrooms, office and kitchen. Jesca thanked IRFF UK, especially the sponsors of the children and teachers for blessing the school. To date the school is receiving £300 per month. There is still a lot of work to be done to find further sponsorship. Our visitor thanked all the teachers and the director of IRFF-Uganda, Mr. Robert Mwogeza for continuing to help the helpless children. The delegation also spent time to check on the performance of pupils, and to listen to the children's poems and songs.











MASAKA ON 29TH JUNE TO 30TH JUNE 2012

Masaka is 125 kms, from Kampala; the IRFF/WAIT volunteers visited the home of two aged women, who are also Tadeo's only remaining relative. On arrival they were welcomed by the community. The ladies live in a house that needs renovation, particularly a new roof, for which irff has already supplied the sheets, nailsetc. Because the water source is very far and there was no water at the house the team walked the 1km to collect water, and made a raised vegetable garden in the home of these old women. They also gave some drugs and food items. The women and community around thanked IRFF UK and all the WAIT volunteers for such a timely help offered to them, we now believe some one some really cares, they said. May God bless you.



While in Masaka the volunteers visited Butale Mixed Primary School where they carried out social responsibility in the school, which included removing jiggers from over 30 pupils and fumigated the classrooms. They were thanked by the head teacher Mr. Nsubuga Francis with chairman PTA. Besides that Ushs 240,000 was donated to improve on sanitation expenses by IRFF-UK.
