Nevertheless, we gave cases of food to anyone who came to the Doolittle Community Center. The goal was to give away everything we had and leave nothing behind. Towards the end of the service project, a family consisting of a mother and a child, and possibly a grandmother, came to the Pop Up and Give. The mother had a strong accent, but regardless, we gave her as much as we could. After filling her trunk with

food items, tears suddenly began to fall from the mother's face. She was overwhelmed by the amount of love and support that she was receiving. As it turned out, her family had come from Ukraine and were currently residing in Las Vegas as refugees. One of the volunteers of the Pop Up and Give rushed in to console and give the mother a hug.



It was surprising to learn that there was a family thousands of miles from home here at the Pop Up and Give. It was a humbling experience to be able to provide love and support for this family, but it was also a heartbreaking and reality-hitting experience as well. The events that are unfolding in Ukraine are unfortunate and tragic, and we pray that there can be more love and peace in this world.
