Declaring a Leap Toward the Next 100 Years

The Korea Religions Association (KRA) commemorated its 60th anniversary by relocating to a new office with a plaque unveiling ceremony on November 6 in central Seoul. The event brought together more than 200 leaders and distinguished guests, including representatives from Korea's major religious traditions and various sectors of society, to celebrate the KRA's new beginning. The event was organized as a declaration of a new leap toward for the next 100 years. In his congratulatory address, Chairman Hong Yun-jong emphasized that "the path pursued by all religions ultimately converges into one shared way," adding that "the religious community should play a central role in guiding the Republic of South Korea toward peace and prosperity." Following his remarks, Venerable Daewoo of Naejangsa Temple recited a poem he had prepared in honor of "The Mother of Love, Han Hak-ja," True Mother, which deeply moved those in attendance. Participants at the ceremony reaffirmed their shared belief that interreligious cooperation and coexistence form

a vital foundation for social integration and peace in Korean society. They pledged to further strengthen interreligious solidarity and practical cooperation in the coming years.
