

FFWPU Uruguay: 30th Corvina Negra Fishing Condition - Ocean Challenge

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From December 7 to 15, 2025, the 30th Corvina Negra Fishing Condition was held in Punta del Este and José Ignacio, Uruguay. Approximately 13 participants gathered with the goal of deepening their understanding and lived experience of the Oceanic Providence across North and South America - a tradition established to promote the unity of the 33 nations of Latin America.

Honoring a 30-Year Legacy

This event marked the continuation of a deeply significant legacy established and upheld by True Parents in Uruguay for three decades. This tradition has been maintained without exception, serving as a testament to their dedication to the ocean as a spiritual and providential frontier.

An Internal and External Discipline

While the group was joined by an elder brother with a long history in the Corvina Negra condition, the majority of the participants were youth.
