Missionary Moon Shin-Chul's Tour: "Building An Identity Of Faith Together With The Younger Generation"

Missionary Moon Shin-chul continued his lecture tour on the theme of the *Great Epic of the Chosen Han People of Korea* with visits to Daejeon Grand Church in the Daejeon–South Chungcheong District (May 9), Cheongju Grand Church in the North Chungcheong District (May 16), Iksan Grand Church in the North Jeolla District (May 23), and Daegu Grand Church in the Daegu–North Gyeongsang District (May 30). At each church, he delivered lectures and participated in discussion sessions with members.

The gatherings brought together younger-generation ministry leaders, core members, young adults and Seonghwa students, providing an opportunity to reflect together on the future direction of faith education and ministry for the

younger generation.

Throughout the tour, Missionary Moon Shin-chul emphasized the importance of nurturing the younger generation in faith. During meetings with ministry leaders, he explained that helping young people grow spiritually requires offering them love and understanding rather than compelling them to adhere to standards and schedules, and that setting an example through one's own life is more important than simply imparting teachings. He also listened to the concerns and challenges faced by those serving in Hyodong, Seonghwa and young adult ministries, engaging in sincere dialogue with teachers and ministry leaders.

During meetings with core members, participants exchanged views on a wide range of topics, including church ministry, education for new members, and creating an environment in which the younger generation can take root in the faith. They openly shared the challenges they face in ministry and reflected together on how to help young people grow in faith.

In the lecture that followed, titled "The Great Epic of the Chosen Han People of Korea", Missionary Moon Shin-chul highlighted both the identity of blessed families and the providential significance of the Han people.

He emphasized that every person is a precious child of Heavenly Parent and explained that, centered on the love of the True Parents, we are called to realize the ideal of one human family. Drawing on experiences from his own journey of faith and personal growth, he encouraged the younger generation to embrace their faith with confidence and put it into practice in their daily lives.

He also spoke about the role of parents and teachers, emphasizing that the family and the church are the two most important environments for passing on faith to the younger generation. He urged parents and educators to nurture children with love and respect, and stressed the importance of understanding our identity as the chosen Han people while striving to be a positive influence in our communities and in every sphere of life.

Following the lecture, young adults, Seonghwa students, and youth ministry leaders gathered for an open dialogue. Participants freely exchanged perspectives on faith, identity, and the roles of both the church and the younger generation, fostering a strong sense of mutual understanding. Their willingness to listen to one another across generations and responsibilities gave the tour even greater significance.

Sonomi Ito, a Seonghwa teacher at Cheongju Grand Church, said, "I renewed my commitment to becoming a teacher who embraces Seonghwa students with love."

Moon Bae-gwan, pastor of Iksan Church, reflected, "I will strive to build a hyojeong church - a community of filial sons and daughters - through action rather than words."

Missionary Moon Shin-heung continued meeting with members through Sunday services, lectures, and discussion sessions during visits to Donghae Church in the Gangwon District (May 10), Giheung Church in the Southern Gyeonggi District (May 17), Buan Church in the Jeonbuk District (May 24), and Seo-gu Church in the Incheon–Western Gyeonggi District (May 31). At each location, core members and younger-generation members gathered to reflect on the value and mission of blessed families and the future of the church.

Through his messages, Missionary Moon Shin-heung encouraged members who have remained steadfast

in their faith despite difficult circumstances, urging them never to lose their identity and pride as blessed families. He explained that the devotion (jeongseong) and love accumulated over the years have sustained the church, and that the challenges of the present should be understood as part of the preparation for a new era.

In his lecture on "The Great Epic of the Chosen Han People of Korea," he spoke about the responsibility and mission of the chosen Han people. He emphasized the value of living not for oneself alone but for the nation and for others, encouraging blessed families to become a positive influence in society. He also explained that a life centered on the True Parents' Will is the starting point for transforming individuals, families, and communities.

Throughout the tour, discussion sessions provided opportunities to exchange ideas on education for the younger generation, parenting, and the role of the church.

In meetings with young adults and younger-generation ministry leaders, Missionary Moon Shin-heung listened attentively to their concerns about faith, career paths, and family life, offering thoughtful and heartfelt guidance. In conversations with core members, he emphasized that creating an environment in which the younger generation can grow securely within the church is one of the community's highest priorities.

Particular attention was also given to the role of parents and teachers. Missionary Moon emphasized that children should be supported with love and

respect so they can walk the path of the Will with confidence and initiative. He also urged the older generation to take responsibility for creating a church environment where the younger generation can find hope and take root in the faith.

He also listened to the voices of members in the field as they exchanged views on a variety of issues facing local churches, including the church's future direction and renewal, helping young adults establish themselves within the church community, and supporting multicultural families. Members took this opportunity to reflect on the direction of their faith and to consider together the respective roles of the church and the younger generation.

Participants shared that the tour had reaffirmed for them the value and mission of blessed families. Yasue Matsumoto of Donghae Church remarked, "I will strive to live a life that returns the love I have received from the True Parents." Toyofumi Aono, pastor of Buan Church, said, "I renewed my determination to live in oneness with Heaven and the True Parents." Young adults likewise shared that the experience gave them a renewed sense of pride and identity as second-generation blessed families.

The nationwide tours of the two Inheritors of Heaven's Love and Blessing continue to bring the message of the Great Epic of the Chosen Han People to local churches across Korea, connecting regions and generations through a shared understanding of True Parents' vision.

Missionary Moon Shin-chul's tour, visiting larger churches in bigger cities has focused on educating the younger generation and strengthening their identity in the faith, while Missionary Moon Shin-heung's tour to the precious churches in Korea's smaller communities has encouraged members by emphasizing the identity of blessed families and the practice of faith in daily life.

Together, these tours have provided a meaningful opportunity to reaffirm the value of the Great Epic of the Chosen Han People, a message that True Parents have been

emphasizing. They have also encouraged blessed families and the younger generation alike to reflect more deeply on their identity, mission, and the direction of their faith.
