

FFWPU DR Congo Youth Department's 7-Day CERP Youth Seminar in Kinshasa

As part of its summer camp program, the Youth Department organized a 7-day CERP Seminar from July 19 to 26, 2026, at the Kimbwala Training Center in Kinshasa, under the theme: "A Filial Heart Toward Holy Mother Han." The session brought together 47 youth (12 boys and 35 girls) aged 13 to 18.

The main objective of this training was to deepen understanding of Heavenly Parent's heart and the True Parents' teachings through the study of the Chambumo Gyeong and the historical epic of the Han people - Korea's chosen people - while developing a spirit of filial piety, responsibility, and leadership among participants.

Throughout the seminar, daily schedules included morning wake-ups, gymnastics, Hoon Dok Hae, community chores, lectures, group work, reflection, and spiritual guidance sessions. Youth also engaged in various educational activities, including short film screenings and educational games designed to reinforce the teachings.

Lectures addressed major themes of divine providence, including the Dream of Heavenly Parent, the Despair of Heavenly Parent, the Essence of Jesus, the Advent of True Parents, and the historical epic of the Han people. Led by national leaders and trainers, these sessions helped participants deepen their understanding of True Parents' vision and their responsibility in building Cheon Il Guk.

The seminar featured a visit from Continental Director Rev. Jean Pierre Kadima, who shared the history of the Kimbwala Training Center and gave a lecture on the four realms of heart and their corresponding virtues. His presence served as a strong source of inspiration and encouragement for the youth.

On the final day, National Leader Rev. Rang Wan Lubaka met with the participants to discuss three essential pillars: sexual purity, a spirit of service, and filial piety. Through his advice and personal testimony, he urged the youth to become role models of faith, morality, and responsibility within their families, communities, and society.

The seminar concluded with final evaluations, cultural activities, participant testimonies, and an official closing ceremony expressing gratitude and encouraging youth to practice what they learned. Overall, the session strengthened the faith, character, and commitment of the young participants, consolidating their identity as the rising generation called to carry forward True Parents' vision.
