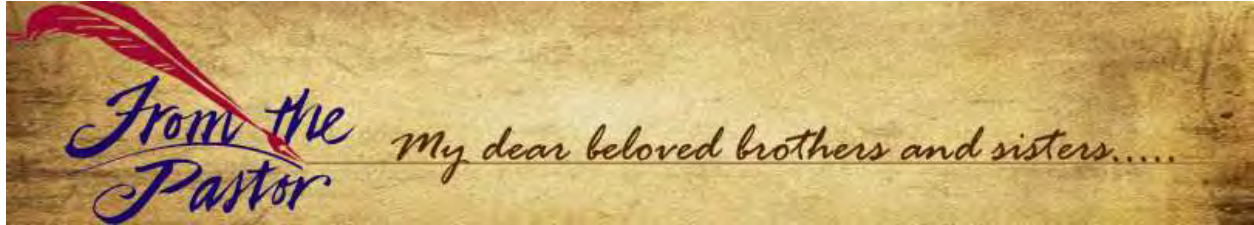


April 19, 2004 True Parents began Ahn Shi II by abolishing Sunday as the Sabbath

Dear brothers and sisters,

On April 19th, 2004 at the New Yorker Hotel, True Parents held the 44th true Parents Day celebrating it with a bowing ceremony and proclaiming Ahn Shi II, the Day of Attendance of Safe Settlement by abolishing the Sabbath, Sunday. Ahn Shi II consists of an 8 day week and on the eighth day of every week Ahn Shi II is celebrated. After the proclamation of Ahn Shi II, for the first time we celebrated Ahn Shi II on may 5th, 2004. But, in reality it is difficult to keep living in an 8 day week system since our current worldwide system runs on 7 a day week.

According to God's will the 8th day became Ahn Shi II. For this reason, we need to follow this tradition and cultivate it so that the future of humanity can have the eighth day to serve God and True Parents.

The Las Vegas Family Church will follow through with this beautiful tradition called Ahn Shi II that True Parents proclaimed. How will we do it?

First, every 8th day of the Sabbath, Sunday and on every 7th Ahn Shi II we will gather as a Church community for celebration. On the morning of that day at 9:00 am, we will have an Ahn Shi II pledge service at the Hoon Dok Hae Room. Following the Ahn Shi II service, we will have our regular Sunday Service at 10:00 am in the sanctuary.

Second, on every 8th day based on our calendar, there will be Ahn Shi II services centering on trinities or tribal messiah families.

Here is the recommended format for Ahn Shi II service:

- Holy songs
- Bowing
- Recitation of the family pledge
- Hoon Dok Hae, and,
- Family or tribe members sharing based on the reading

The first Las Vegas Family Church wide Ahn Shi II service will take place this Sunday, April 23rd in the Hoon Dok Hae Room. The service will start at 9:00 am sharp. Please arrive by 8:50 am so we can start on time.

Let's all come together this Sunday to launch this beautiful heavenly tradition in our community.
