We sincerely would like to invite you to our event dedicated to the 3rd anniversary of the war in Ukraine. As part of this event, we want to show you 2 films. Both of them are based on true stories.



The first movie is "**Porcelain War**" (2023). It is a documentary that follows three Ukrainian artists who trade their paint brushes for weapons to defend their country against the Russian invasion. The film captures their transformation from creatives to soldiers, highlighting their resilience, sacrifices, and the emotional toll of war. It blends raw frontline footage with personal stories, showing how art, love, and humanity endure even in the darkest times. The film won the **U.S. Documentary Grand Jury**

Prize at the 2024 Sundance Film Festival for its powerful storytelling and unique perspective on war.

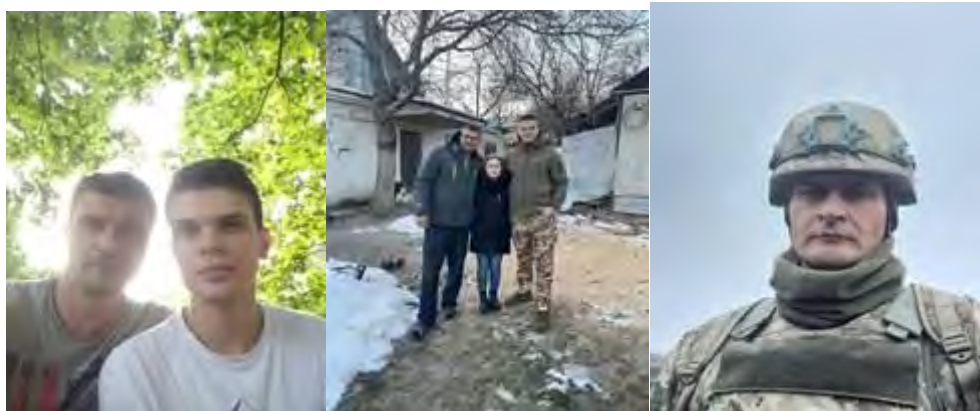

Please, watch the “Bucha” movie before the event!



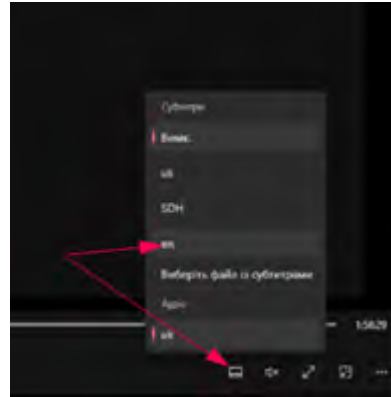
The second movie is “**Bucha**” (2023). A war drama based on real events that took place in Bucha, Ukraine, during the first days of Russia's full-scale invasion in 2022. The film describes the tragic and harrowing experiences of Ukrainian civilians facing a brutal occupation. The film serves as a powerful reminder of the atrocities committed by the Russian military and the ongoing struggle for freedom in Ukraine.
