Ongoing Interfaith Activities in Grand Junction



On April 25th, we had our monthly Interreligious Sharing Series program via zoom. The topic was, "How and Why did Mankind Separate from God?" The religious leaders and representatives were from The United Methodist Church, the Bah'ai faith, Christian Science Church, The Latter-day Saints, and WFWP/UPF. A portion of all of our perspectives on the topic:

Christian Science: It is a false assumption that we are separated from God. It's impossible!

Latter-Day Saints: We are all children of God. We pre-existed in the spirit world before we were given a physical body. The earthly life gives people a chance to live and spiritually grow and to become more like God. An unclean person cannot live in front of God. Satan led a group of spirits in the spirit world to not come to earth and take on a physical body. These spirits have not grown and are therefore separated from God.

First United Methodist Church: God was in heaven and Satan did not want God to be the ruler of this world. Lucifer tempted Adam and Eve to disobey God in the Garden of Eden. God did not want evil, but He gave mankind free will to make our own decisions. Jesus the Savior was sent to reconnect all of us back to God. "No one comes to the Father except through me..." John 14:6.

Baha'i: Adam and Eve disobeyed God in the Garden of Eden and that is why the Manifestations of God had to come to the earth, to bring everlasting life to humanity: Abraham, Moses, Zoroaster, Buddha, Jesus Christ, Mohammad and Baha'ull'ah. They are the Trees of Life. Adam signifies the heavenly spirit of God. Eve His human soul.The tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil signifies the human world. The serpent is the attachment of the soul and spirit to the human world.

WFWP/UPF: The Fall of Man as told in Genesis is full of symbols, yet portrays an actual incident of our first human ancestors. The death that resulted from the Fall was a spiritual death. Adam and Eve had a premature sexual relationship before they had matured their characters centered on goodness. God gave them the commandment in Gen. 3:16 to prevent them from doing this while they were in the growing period, wanting Adam and Eve to preserve their purity. They were tempted by the serpent who symbolized Lucifer, who then became Satan. The Fall of Man is a great tragedy that never should have occurred. Mankind was meant to fulfill the 3 Great Blessings; a Savior was not supposed to have been needed as mankind should not have separated from God.

All the participants listened closely to each other's presentations. Our perspective gave them all a new point of view to consider. Yet, we are all grateful for Jesus. We all agreed spiritual growth and overcoming sin takes a lot of constant effort.

The crazy windstorm this month accelerated some of the projects that we had been putting off due to the amount of damage it caused to some of our awnings and fences.

In addition, David Mahardy has been hard at work renovating the church kitchen. Despite some plumbing setbacks, work is progressing really well and we are grateful to his dedication to this project.

Also, we have been making great progress on our exterior renovation work and implementing the improvements made possible by the Nonprofit Security Grant. The main entrance awning has been removed in preparation for the stonework and stucco. The old chain–link fence along the parking lot has been removed and replaced/extended with a nice new black metal fence. In addition, we have new cameras and a new access entry system and alarm system for all entryways of the church.
