b. Work with the support and full backing of the Community Council, including former National Leader, Mr. Simon Cooper, and current Assistant Pastor Mr. Maskazu Hayashi, in order to give you the confidence to take up this challenging and pioneering role. We won't expect you to do everything, but just do what is most important well.

c. Communicate the good news and recognise and celebrate what is happening in the community. This could include developing the regular email newsletter and potentially via social media platforms.

Youth Work, which could include experience with STF, ESGD, HARP and CARP.
